

## Your questions answered:

### If I park on my property in a street with a resident parking zone scheme, do I have to have a permit?

No, you do not need to have a permit when parked on your own property i.e. on your drive.

### Do I need a permit to park my motorcycle in a street with a resident parking zone scheme?

No. Motorcyclists are entitled to free and unlimited parking.

### What happens when I have visitors in a street with a resident parking zone scheme?

If you have visitors, you can provide them with a visitor parking permit. You are currently allowed a maximum of three permits per household or business. Transferable paper visitor permits will be available on request.

### I have a carer. Are carers entitled to apply for a resident parking permit?

No - carers cannot apply for a resident's parking permit. Carers will be required to use one of your visitor parking permits or if you are housebound and require regular care or nursing attendance, your carer may qualify for a free carers permit. Carers can also apply for a Medical Permit that will cover them in other parking schemes across the city.

### Where can blue badge holders park?

Blue badge holders can park without time restrictions when parking, where there are residents parking restrictions, providing the blue badge is correctly displayed.

### What happens with tradesmen working on my property in a street with a resident parking scheme?

You will need to let them display one of your visitor permits.

### Will a parking permit guarantee me the right to park outside my house or business?

No. We cannot reserve parking spaces for groups or individuals. However, by preventing commuters from parking in the area throughout the day, it will make it much more likely that you will be able to find parking spaces near to your property.

### How will the regulations be enforced?

Uniformed Civil Enforcement Officers will patrol the area and will issue a penalty charge notice (PCN) to any vehicle that is illegally parked during the hours of operation.

### Will I be issued with a PCN if I don't have a valid permit in a street with a resident parking zone scheme?

Yes. Failure to have a permit in the residents parking street during the hours of operation will mean that you will be issued with a parking ticket PCN and currently have to pay £70, reduced to £35 if paid within 14 days.

### What happens if my permit is persistently wrongly used?

If there is reasonable evidence that the use of the permit is being abused the permit could be cancelled and you would get no refund.

### What if we don't want resident parking in our street?

We are in the consultation stage now. If there is an overwhelming view that people don't want the proposed measures in their street, we won't introduce it. Therefore it is important you communicate your views in favour or against the proposals now and later if we advertise formally.

#### Please Note

All users need to remember that a permit does not reserve a space – or guarantee parking outside their home or business.

## Proposed Resident Parking Scheme – Tile Hill Station area

Following concerns raised by local people about rail users who are leaving their cars parked all day in and around the local area we want to know what you think about a resident parking scheme.

The scheme would be in place for an hour in the morning and an hour in the afternoon. This would stop non permit holders parking all day as they would have to return to move their car when the parking restriction is in operation. Double yellow lines would also be installed to prevent parking in some areas such as at junctions.

You would be able to purchase a parking permit to allow you and your visitors to park in the resident parking area. Non-residents would not be able to have a permit and could not park their cars all day.

We are proposing two resident parking zones:

- **Zone TA** – for the area north of the station resident parking in operation 9am to 10am and 1pm to 2pm
- **Zone CL** – for the area south of the station resident parking in operation 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm

The plan inside shows the proposed restrictions

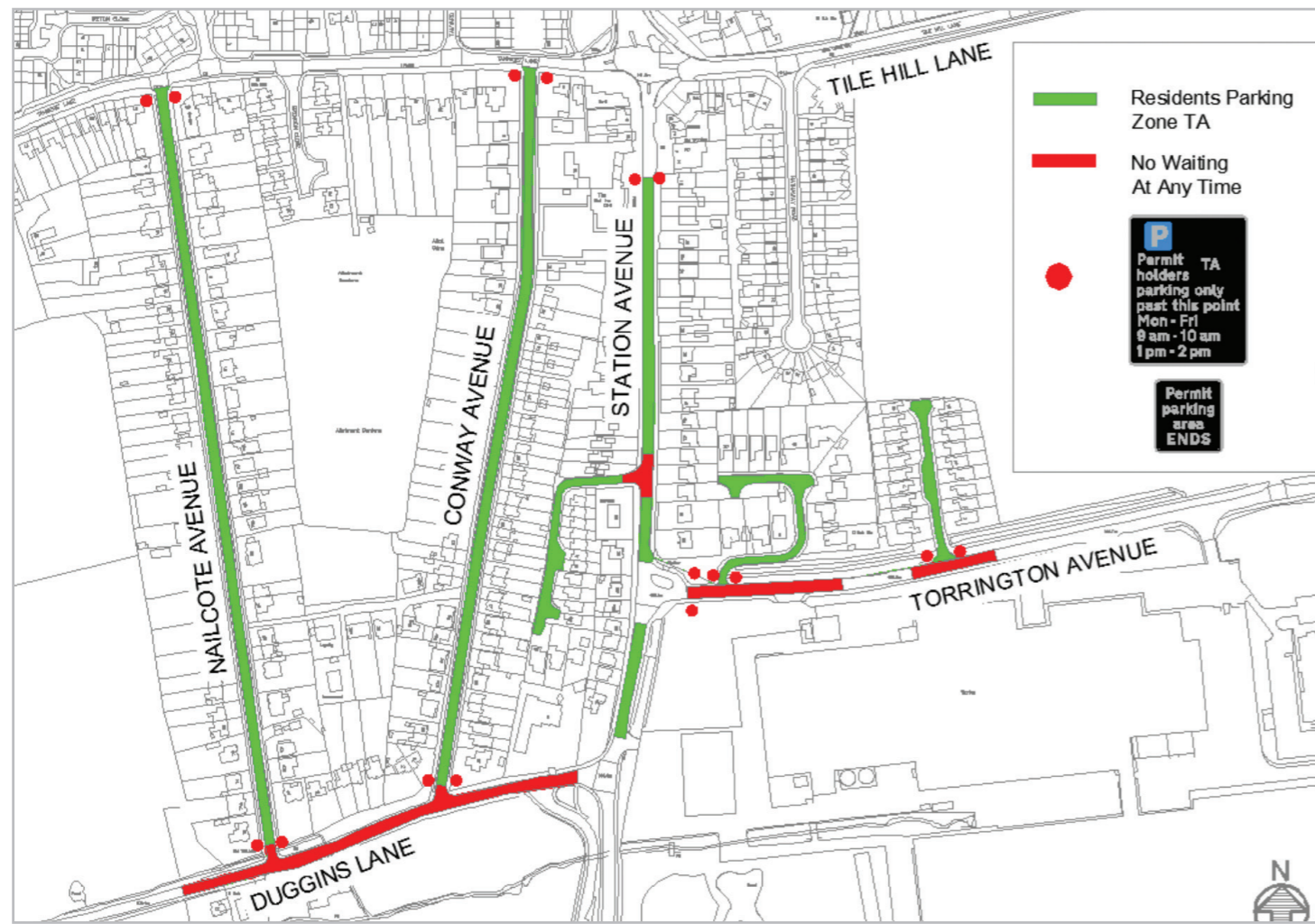

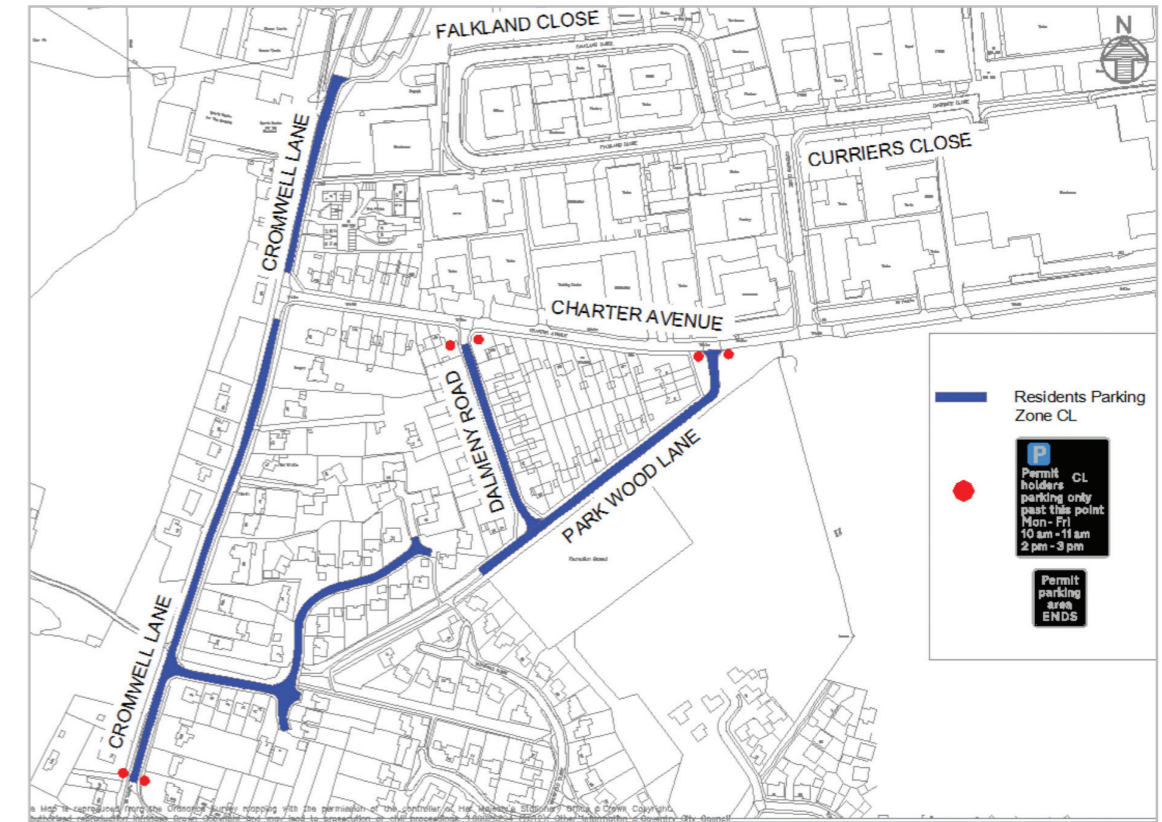

## How would a parking zone scheme work?



Residents and businesses within the resident permit parking area would need to apply for a permit to park in the street during the restricted hours. These permits are 'virtual' or paperless – similar to the new car tax system, and will only be eligible for use in this parking zone. The virtual permits are linked to the vehicle registration number so you do not display a permit. These are applied for online or by telephone. In addition transferable paper visitor permits will be made available on request. Blue badge holders do not need a permit to park.

All users need to remember that a permit does not reserve a space – or guarantee parking outside their home.

All residents and businesses within the resident parking zone area would be eligible to apply for parking permits for themselves and visitors to use for on street parking. However visitor permits are limited to a maximum of 3.

The proposed parking scheme for your area would include a combination of the following: **Permit holders only** – bays in which only vehicles holding a valid permit may park during the hours of operation

If the consultation shows that residents want a scheme, the installation of the scheme will be paid for by the Coventry City Council.

The permits will have to be paid for by residents and currently cost £20 each and are valid for 3 years.
