# Report to Coventry School Admissions Forum Friday 24 September 2010

Implementation of the In-Year Fair Access Protocol – third year review: Operation of the Social Inclusion Placements Panel 2009/10

## 1. Background.

- 1.1 Under the School Admissions Code all admission authorities and Admission Forums have been required to have an In-Year Fair Access Protocol in place since September 2007 (formerly referred to as "hard to place pupil protocol"). All schools and Academies are required to participate in their local authority area's protocol in order to ensure that unplaced children, especially the most vulnerable, are offered a place at a suitable school as quickly as possible. This includes admitting children above the published admission number to schools that are already full and ensures that all schools in an area admit their fair share of children with challenging behaviour, including children excluded from other schools...
- 1.2 Section 4.31 of the Admissions Code 2010 requires that Admission Forums monitor the effectiveness of local authority Fair Access Protocols.

#### The forum should consider:

- how well the In-Year Fair Access protocol is working
- how quickly children are found places
- and the contribution every school in the area is making.

### 2. Coventry's In-Year Fair Access Protocol

- 2.1 Coventry's Protocol covers two groups of children:
  - -Children who have been permanently excluded from school or who are at risk of permanent exclusion (managed transfers)
  - -Hard-to-place pupils.
- 2.2 For a pupil to be considered hard-to-place there should be evidence of one or more of the following:
  - Previous and recent permanent exclusion, a high number of fixed term exclusions or managed move/transfer

- Recent history of significant behaviour problems
- Recent history of offending
- Persistent and poor attendance, at least below 80%
- Lengthy periods of absence from education
- Mental health problems
- Significant social/emotional difficulties resulting from adverse home circumstances
- Parental concerns/ parents who are hard to engage.
- 2.3 The Local Authority has used a formula to determine the number of pupils in both categories each school will be expected to take. The formula takes account of the differing contexts and circumstances of schools, in particular the size of school, the degree of transience faced by the school and the relative deprivation of the school's population.
- 2.4 For 2008/09 and 2009/10 changes were made to the number of pupils to be admitted at seven of the Authority's secondary schools to take account of the National Challenge. These were agreed by the secondary heads and were based on a graduated approach to the seven schools according to the level of challenge they faced.
- 2.5 The table attached as appendix 1 sets out the numbers of managed transfers/permanent exclusions and hard to place pupils which schools were expected to admit during the academic year 2009/10. The formula is based on 45 pupils in each category but this reduced to 35 in each category following the adjustment for the National Challenge schools.

# 3. Permanent exclusions / Managed transfers

3.1 During the academic year 2009/10 there were 19 permanent exclusions from secondary schools and 70 managed transfer requests. In addition four children who live in Coventry but who were permanently excluded from schools in other local authorities were also supported. Trends over the last 6 years are given below:

Information on the 89 pupils for 2009/10 is contained in appendix 2.

- 3.2 Pupils in key stage 3 normally spend a period of time at the Grange Extended Learning Centre (12 FTE places) or Wyken Extended Learning Centre (24 FTE places). Pupils living in the west of the city are normally placed at the Grange ELC and those in the east at Wyken ELC. 43 KS3 pupils were referred in 2009/10. The aim of the KS3 ELCs is to support pupils to return to another mainstream school. Pupils are reintegrated when appropriate and receive support from an outreach worker. 15 pupils returned to mainstream school from the ELCs in 2009/10.
- 3.3 Pupils in key stage 4 are usually allocated a place at Chace ELC/Individual Programmes, a small number may return directly to a new mainstream school. In 2009/10 46 key stage 4 referrals were received which was higher than in 2008/09 (34) but similar to the academic years 07/08 (48) and 06/07 (44). In the autumn term 08 (November) the LA introduced more robust arrangements for key stage 4 referrals which included all such cases being considered by the Social Inclusion Placements Panel. These arrangements were introduced because of concerns at the high number of pupils being referred to Chace ELC. Three requests for Chace ELC were refused by the Social Inclusion Placements Panel. In 2009/10 seven key stage 4 pupils were allocated places in mainstream schools.

# 4. Hard to place pupils

- 4.1 The Social Inclusion Panel met on a monthly basis during the academic year. The panel is Chaired by the Business and Performance Manager and comprises senior officers from appropriate Local Authority Services and four headteacher representatives, one from each of the 4 secondary federations. Heads attend 3 meetings on a rolling programme to support consistency in decision making.
- 4.2 90 cases were discussed across the 11 meetings which were held (79 in 2008/09). Most cases were identified by the admissions team as potentially hard to place because of one or more of the issues outlined in paragraph 2.2 above. Information on these pupils is contained in appendix 3. 35 pupils were confirmed as hard to place and were agreed as supported transfers into an alternative mainstream school, 24 in key stage 3 and 11 in key stage 4 (22 in 2008/09).
- 4.3 Trends over the past three years are given below:
