

## **Admissions consultation for 2012**

Please see below summary details of the schools which are consulting on their admissions policies for 2012. If members would like to see the proposed policies in detail these are available on the city council website

### **Primary schools**

#### **St John's Church of England Primary School**

The school are proposing an adjustment regarding part time attendance in line with the School Admissions Code, and have changed the wording in the over subscription criteria definitions regarding other Christian churches.

#### **Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School**

The school is proposing changes to the explanation of the waiting list policy and the availability of parish maps. They have also introduced a supplementary information form.

#### **St Augustine's Catholic Primary School**

The school have increased their admission number from 45 to 60 (note this has already been agreed via statutory notice). They are proposing to change the wording in oversubscription criteria to "Parish of St Augustine's", and proposing changes to the explanation of the waiting list policy and the availability of parish maps.

#### **SS Peter and Paul's Catholic Primary School**

The school is proposing changes to information on the availability of parish maps.

### **Secondary schools**

#### **Blue Coat Church of England School and Music College**

The school are proposing changes on wording around sibling criteria and the definitions of regular worship, and they require the completion of supplementary information forms for looked after children, and will no longer add churches to the list of published churches within their policy during the course of a year.

#### **Whitley Abbey Business and Enterprise College**

The school are proposing an increase to their admission number from 150 to 160. They have also considerably re-written the wording of their policy to follow more closely the criteria and definitions used by other Trust schools and the Local Authority.

The local authority will be responding to all these schools prior to the next School Admissions Forum and will provide details at the meeting. To date we have not received any comments regarding the local authority schemes and admissions policies for primary and secondary community and voluntary controlled schools. If there are any issues raised prior to the meeting date we will provide an additional verbal report.

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
