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If NO please explain: : We do not have a formal FAP for primary schools as current admissions processes enable us to ensure access to school places quickly, whilst not requiring undersubscribed schools to admit a greater proportion of children with a recent history of challenging behaviour. These systems will be kept under review.

b) Give your assessment of how well the Fair Access Protocol has worked since 1 September 2010. In particular in placing children, the co-operation of schools and Academies as well as any other issues you have had in implementing the protocol.

We have robust systems in place for pupils at risk of exclusion and the FAP has built upon this work. All 17 secondary schools and 2 Academies have co-operated in implementing the protocol and agreeing a service level agreement which identified the share of hard to place children to be admitted to schools and alternative provision. Whilst there have been disputes on decisions made in some individual cases, dialogue with headteachers takes place to resolve issues

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Free School Meals

In general data from January 2011 census is not significantly different. There are changes of note at 13 schools. 7 primary schools showed increases of 5-8% and 1 Academy increased by 6.5%. 4 primary schools showed decreases of 5-7% and 1 special school of 5.9%.

Using and interpreting the data, please comment on whether the allocation of school places meets parental preferences for those children on Free School Meals.

Parents on FSM are 0.2% more likely to get their 1st preference for primary school, and 2.5% less likely to get their 1st preference for secondary school than those parents not on FSM. Overall we would say that the allocation does meet parental preference.

Research was undertaken regarding school uniform requirements by the Coventry School Admissions Forum and the results were that all schools in the city were found to be working well in ensuring that uniform costs and availability did not create barriers to admission.

The Choice Adviser uses previous years' data to identify those schools/communities that have parents who fit into the "hard to reach" criteria, and engages them through home visits, school/community events. This is also done through liaison with other professionals and teams, such as Learning Mentors, LAC teams, Traveller Services, Multi-disciplinary Teams and Minority Group Support Services. They help identify parents who fit the hard-to-reach criteria, and can then be engaged through home visits, telephone conversations or pre-arranged meetings. There is also information and guidance provided in depth via the website, which should aid those more able parents and allow the Choice Adviser to concentrate on those parents that need most support

Describe how Choice Advice has contributed to the fairness of the e) admissions process.

More parents in Coventry are fully aware of how the process works and the information available on individual schools, thanks to the outreach work that has been done by the Choice Adviser. However, whilst improving parents understanding of the system, there remains the difficulty of the reality of the allocation of school places and the issue of "preference"/"choice". There has also been a far more active role in supporting hard to reach parents through the appeals process
