### 171. **Declarations of Interest**

### 172. Consideration of Call Ins – Stage 1

# 173. Refresh of the Coventry Local Area Agreement

A revised Appendix to the report was tabled at the meeting and this detailed the position on the Coventry Local Area Agreement Priorities, Indicators and Targets as at 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2009.

# 174. Multi Area Agreement on Employment and Skills

The Committee considered a joint report, and included as an Appendix, a draft Multi Area Agreement (MAA) on Employment and Skills document for submission by the City Region of Birmingham, Coventry and the Black Country and its partners to central Government. The report was also to be considered by the Cabinet and the City Council.

It was proposed that the current successful City Strategy pathfinder programme was developed into a formal four year sub-regional Multi-Area Agreement with central Government. The MAA would cover the eight city strategy local authorities: Coventry, Birmingham, Solihull, Sandwell, Dudley, Walsall, Wolverhampton and Telford. Importantly, Warwickshire County Council was collaborating with the development of the MAA.

The aim of the MAA would be to deliver increasing numbers of people in sustainable employment within the city region and this would be achieved by removing a number of barriers; inflexibilities and inconsistencies in the way that services were currently being delivered and to delegate decision making currently made at a national level to the local partners.

The Committee noted that there was an exit strategy.

### **RESOLVED** that the report be endorsed.

### 175. **Report Back on the Work of Outside Bodies – Belgrade Theatre Trust**

The Committee considered a report of Councillor Blundell that detailed the work of the Belgrade Theatre Trust over the preceding twelve months and included details of attendance by the City Council's representatives.

RESOLVED that the Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee recommend that the City Council agree that the current City Council representatives serving on the Groundwork Coventry and Warwickshire Board extend their period of tenure until the Trust is wound up and becomes assimilated into Groundwork West Midlands.
