1. Recommendation

1.1 Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee is asked to note the report setting out the benefits of attending the Local Government Association Annual Conference 2010.

2. Background

- 2.1 Coventry City Council is a member of the Local Government Association (LGA) which is a voluntary organisation for local authorities in England and Wales to provide a national voice for local government and improve public services for local people.
- 2.2 The LGA conference is the key local government event of the year and is attended by Government Ministers and MPs including senior politicians from all parties; senior civil servants and senior figures from across the public, voluntary and private sector as well as elected members and senior officers from all types of local authorities.
- 2.3 The 2010 conference took place within the context of the new Coalition Government and during the preparation for the Comprehensive Spending Review for October 2010.
- 2.4 This year's LGA annual conference was attended by Cllr Lucas, Cllr Kelly, Cllr Abbott, Cllr Taylor and Cllr Foster. (Attendance at Conference Form attached)

3. Cost of attending

Conference Fees: £2595 (£519 x 5)

Flights: n/a

Travel Costs: £70.50

Accommodation: £724 – (Councillor Lucas's accommodation was funded by the LGA)

4. Benefits

- 4.1 The conference was titled "changing times, changing minds" and provided the opportunity to learn more about developing central government policy and the implications for local government. This was particularly important this year as the new Coalition Government is making significant changes to policy that will have significant impact on all the council's services and local people.
- 4.2 The conference covered a wide range of service and policy areas including: young people and education; social care; community safety; climate change; the recession and support to businesses; transport; sport and leisure; local government management; efficiency and funding.
- 4.3 There was particular focus on the likely content on the then forthcoming Comprehensive Spending Review and the potentially unprecedented reduction in funding for local authorities and other public sector bodies. This information helped to inform the Council's planning in advance of the CSR and the budget setting for 2011/12.
- 4.4 The conference also enabled councillors to promote the city's interests and lobby central government. One specific example was the opportunity to question the Secretary of State for Education, Michael Gove MP, about the impact of the ending of Building Schools for the Future on Coventry's schools. This helped lead to a visit to the city from officials from the Department of Education for discussions about other capital funding that might be available from government for local schools.
