## 1. Recommendation

1.1 Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee is asked to note the report setting out the benefits of attending the Local Government Association Conference 2011.

### 2. Background

- 2.1 Coventry City Council is member of the Local Government Association (LGA) which is a voluntary organisation for local authorities in England and Wales to provide a national voice for local government and improve public services for local people.
- 2.2 The LGA conference is the key local government event of the year and is attended by Government Ministers and MPs including senior politicians from all parties; senior civil servants and senior figures from across the public, voluntary and private sector as well as elected members and senior officers from all types of local authorities.
- 2.3 The 2011 conference took place with the context of the coalition government unprecedented cuts in finance to Local Government, rising unemployment and increased demand on services.
- 2.4 The conference was attended by Councillor Lucas, Councillor Walsh, Councillor Chater, Councillor Blundell and Councillor Taylor.

#### 4. Benefits

The conference was entitled 'Localism Works' and asked how the role of government should be defined in this 'Brave New World'; as the body for local leadership, a commissioning hub, an information centre for stimulating local activity or all of the above.

- **4.1** For the first time conference was addressed by the leaders of all three major political parties and lively Question & Answer sessions followed, as is to be expected at an all party conference.
- **4.2** There were also opportunities to promote the city's interest and lobby central government, including both cabinet ministers and the shadow cabinet ministers.
- **4.3** Best practice was widely shared with both elected members and officers. An example is the contact with authorities who have completed their first Domestic Homicide Review; with their freely given help and advice, substantial costs to Coventry may be avoided.
- **4.4** The plenary sessions, workshops and the events at the conference allowed the delegation to play a meaningful part in the debates on the theme of the conference (Localism Works).
