4. Benefits

This was an extremely useful and interesting event with a good deal of engagement (questions and answers) mixed in with presentations from influential and knowledgeable experts in the field.

- 1. The seminar examined how progression in house build could be maintained during a recession and the best methods of delivering targets and standards.
- 2. Richard McCarthy (Department for Communities and Local Government) spoke clearly on the need for more housing land because of the rise in population and households. He spoke of the need for urgency in 'unlocking' public land so that the supply in each local authority could be increased as swiftly as possible.
- 3. Richard Marsh of The Tenant Services Authority said 'Five million people are on housing lists for affordable housing.' He gave a list of what was important for elected members and officers to take into account when considering new social/affordable housing: 'Improve standards of service delivery for tenants. Support 'decent' homes and neighbourhoods. Promote effective tenant involvement and empowerment. Ensure providers are well run and deliver value for money. Promote and protect public and private investment. Encourage and support a supply of well managed social housing.'
- Of particular interest was the speech made by Richard Capie of the Chartered Institute of Housing who spoke on better management of existing stock especially with

regard to empty homes and the impact that could be made by bringing them back

into use.
