Executive Summary:

The purpose of this report is to consider an application for a Review of a Premises Licence submitted by the Environmental Protection Team under the Licensing Act 2003 for The Oak Inn, 119 Gosford Street, Coventry, CV1 5DL.

Report title: Premises Licence Review Application

1. Context (or background)

- 1.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires Coventry City Council, as the Licensing Authority, to carry out its various licensing functions so as to promote the following four Licensing Objectives:
 - The Prevention of crime & disorder
 - The Protection of public safety
 - The Prevention of public nuisance
 - The Protection of children from harm
- 1.2 A Premises Licence Review application for The Oak Inn, 119 Gosford Street, Coventry was received on 25 July 2024. The application has been submitted by the Environmental Protection Team following several witnessed noise nuisance reports at the premises. Further breaches of the Noise Abatement Notices have also been witnessed.
- 1.3 There has been persistent ongoing noise nuisance from the premises due to loud amplified music coming from outside and inside the premises since December 2023. This has resulted in eight separate complaints and eight noise reports from the Officers working on the night-time noise monitoring service. They have witnessed repeated noise issues from the premises. The application states that this undermines the Licensing Objective of Prevention of Public Nuisance.
- 1.4 During the consultation period, a Transfer Application to change the Premise Licence Holder was received and granted. The DPS remained unchanged.
- 1.5 The Licensing Act 2003 requires the Council to publish a 'Statement of Licensing Policy' which sets out the policies the Council will have regard to and apply to promote the Licensing Objectives when making a decision on applications made under the Act. The Policy will be available at the hearing for reference purposes.
- 1.6 It is essential that the Sub-Committee takes into account the government's guidance to the Licensing Act before reaching a decision. The applicant, Responsible Authorities, or any other persons, should bring to the Sub-Committee's attention any relevant paragraphs. However, it is suggested good practice for Members of the Sub-Committee to read the relevant paragraph(s) of the guidance prior to the hearing.

2. Options considered and recommended proposal

- 2.1 There are five courses of action available to the Sub-Committee in relation to this application:
 - modify the conditions of the licence;
 - exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - remove the DPS:
 - suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months; or
 - revoke the licence.
- 2.2 The Sub-Committee is recommended to consider this matter on its merits in accordance with statutory requirements and the Council's licensing policies, where relevant.

3. Results of consultation undertaken

- 3.1 As prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003, the application has been out for consultation to statutory consultees for 28 days. The consultation period began on 25 July 2024 until 22 August 2024.

4. Timetable for implementing this decision

4.1 The Appeal period is 21 days beginning on the date that the Appellant(s) receive notification of the decision of the Licensing Authority.

5.1 Financial implications

There are no financial implications arising directly from this report. However, there are possible cost implications if an appeal against the decision is made to the Magistrates Court and the decision of the Sub-Committee is not upheld.

5.2 Legal implications

The Licensing Act 2003 sets out how an application, and subsequent hearing, for a Review of a Premises Licence should be conducted. The Sub-Committee must decide, having heard all representations, the outcome of the application taking into account the four Licensing Objectives as well as Statutory guidance and the Council's own policies.

In accordance with the provisions of the Act, all interested parties may appeal against the decision, to a Magistrates' court within 21 days of receiving notification of the decision.

6. Other implications

6.1 How will this contribute to achievement of the One Coventry Plan?

It is the Regulatory Services team's responsibility to ensure that members of the public in Coventry are not put at risk. This contributes to the Council's core aim of ensuring that citizens live longer healthier lives. The business failure to uphold the Licensing Objectives may have an adverse effect on Public Safety and citizen's quality of life. This aligns with the One Coventry Plan to work together to improve our city and the lives of those who live, work and study here.

6.2 How is risk being managed?

If the application is not handled in line with the Licensing Act 2003, there is a risk of judicial appeals, reviews and associated costs.

There has been persistent ongoing noise nuisance from the premises due to loud amplified music coming from outside and inside the premises since December 2023.

This has resulted in eight separate complaints and eight noise reports from our officers working on the night-time noise monitoring service confirm witnessed repeated noise issues from the premises including:

- Extremely loud music being heard in neighbours' bedrooms and lyrics to songs being clearly heard even with windows closed.
- Loud bass beats causing sleep disturbance and stress to neighbours, this hugely impacts on people's health and daily lives when stressed and losing sleep.
- Repeated events of the above and doors being left open at the premises making the problems even worse.
- Initial failure to remove loudspeakers from the outdoor area and then reinstalling them after officers have left the premises.
- These statutory noise nuisance events have occurred late at night and into the early hours on eight separate occasions ranging from 23:30, 23:50, 01:08, 01:28, 01:33, 01:56, 02:00 and 02:21 hours. Eight noise witness reports are available to confirm details of what was heard and where the noise monitoring was conducted.
- Ignorance of their own licensing conditions.
- Completely ignoring the noise abatement notice.
- Failing to follow up on advice for soundproofing.
- A rear fire door and other doors being left open causing noise to escape from the building despite the management saying they keep closing doors and windows.

- A belief by the management they are allowed to be loud before 23:30 hours despite it being obvious that they have to control music volume at all times and being told so on numerous occasions.
- Responding to officer's emails when issued with noise warning letters with one line responses and ridiculous excuses for loud music such as "we had a birthday party".
- These events have repeatedly happened during the week and weekends even after warnings have been issued. As a result, people have been unable to sleep, causing them severe stress and affecting their health. I have had conversations with people affected who have not been able to do their jobs properly because they are so tired.
- From the first complaint in December 2023 CCC officers have tried to work with and advise the licensees informally to resolve the noise issues. Support and advice has been given through site visits, email and phone calls but unfortunately the advice has been ignored, agreements have been broken and assurances by the licensees have not been adhered to.
- Noise abatement notices have been served on the DPS and PLH, but these have been breached on several occasions and non-compliance is continuing.

In my view I have no confidence in the management of the premises, and it is highly likely that noise issues will continue adversely affecting the lives of nearby residents.

I would request that Licensing committee consider taking one of the following options:

Revoke the license.

OR

2. Removal of rights under deregulation (Live Music Act 2012)

No music outdoors at any time

Music indoors until 23.00hrs subject to the following conditions:

- All windows to be kept closed, and all doors save for normal access/egress during regulated entertainment
- Noise limiting device to be installed by a competent qualified engineer and connected to (to be specified) doors and windows.
- All staff to be trained and made aware of these conditions, a record of such training will be placed in the site register

The reason for the second meeting was that although external speakers had been removed it was apparent that advice from the first meeting was not being given due attention. Continuing excessively loud music from inside the pub was causing noise nuisance to neighbours.

Discussed the continuing non-compliance with NAN's (Noise Abatement Notices), advised about noise control and reinforced that the licensees needed to:

- Reduce the volume of the music.
- Keep doors and windows closed to stop the sounds escaping and affecting neighbours.

I noted the ground floor has single glazed windows and an air vent near the DJ booth which could also allow noise to escape (breakout) from the building. For this reason, as the building has such poor sound insulation and openings where noise can breakout; I recommended they get a noise consultant to do a survey and produce a scheme of sound insulation.

Following our visit on the 12/01/24 including my colleague Rekha Masih (Licensing Officer) and meeting with your manager Ziyaddin Ayyaldiz I can confirm the following:

The premises license does not permit music in the outdoor areas including background music and you must remove the loudspeakers from the outdoor area. So, from now on there should be no music played outdoors at any time; this is required by your license conditions and if music is played outdoors again then you could be in breach of your license conditions and further action taken.

There have been two incidents of noise nuisance from music outdoors and officers have witnessed statutory noise nuisances due to excessively loud music coming from a marquee in the rear beer garden on the:

17/12/23 between 01:56 and 02:21 hours. And 05/01/24 between 02:30 and 02:45 hours.

If further noise complaints are received, then you could also be served with a noise abatement notice. If the Local Authority is satisfied that a nuisance has occurred and may recur a legal notice must be served requiring the abatement of further nuisances. If the noise continues to occur and further nuisances are proved to exist beyond all reasonable doubt then the person responsible may be prosecuted in a Magistrates Court, and liable to a fine. I appreciate you have been doing your best keeping doors closed and removing the outdoor speakers, but the volume of the music and late hours has still caused a noise nuisance. The noise abatement notices have been breached and I would suggest you seek independent legal advice as these are offences under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and I need to refer them to legal.

I will work with you as much as possible with our Licensing officers to help you make sure there are no further breaches of the notice, but you do need to realise that there may be legal proceedings and a possible fine if things do not improve.

I would recommend you get a noise consultant as there is an ongoing noise nuisance from loud music and a qualified noise consultant will be able help you with noise control. https://www.association-of-noise-consultants.co.uk/

I suggest you get someone with experience with licensed premises and get three quotes from different consultants.

Cemil stated yesterday that you would be turning the music off until the situation is improved after advice from a noise consultant and I agree this is a sensible approach for now.

The building could be allowing a lot of noise to escape through air vents and single glazed windows and there isn't any sound insulation.

I have not received the reply forms you were filling in yesterday, so you need to email them to me as soon as possible please.

a) General - All four Licensing Objectives

Application is made to reinstate the Premises Licence revoked on the 15th November. Application is made by Marston's Plc who did not operate the premises at the time of the Review and who have worked with West Midlands in connection with the terms upon which the re-licensing of the premises should be undertaken.

It is intended that the premises should continue to trade as a late night venue but on lesser hours and with new management.

The above is provided by way of explanation and not intended to be converted into conditions.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below:

- 1. CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.
- (a) Cameras shall encompass all ingress, egress and include all areas to which the public have access, including fire escapes, stairwells and where the supply of alcohol occurs (with the exception of areas agreed by the Police, for example toilet cubicles).
- (b) The CCTV shall be recording at all times that the premises are open to the public.
- (c) Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be retained securely for a period of 31 days and handed to Police upon reasonable request.
- (d) The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed members of staff are capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format to the Police and Local Authority upon reasonable request.
- (e) The Police or local authority will be given a copy of the CCTV in a suitable format within 48 hours of any reasonable request.
- (f) A member of staff shall be present at all reasonable times when the premises is operating to download footage from CCTV or Body Worn Cameras upon the reasonable request of the Police.
- 2. Door supervisors shall be employed in line with the written risk assessment.
- 3. All door supervisors should at all times when working wear uniform that clearly identifies them to the public as door supervisors including high visibility tabard bearing identification reference, SIA accreditation and will use Body Worn Video (BWV)
- 4. All BWV footage will be retained for a minimum of 21 days and shall be produced to the Police or Responsible Authority within 48 hours of request. - (a) Strategies to minimise the use and supply of illegal drugs within the premises.
- (b) Agreed procedure for the handling and retention of any article seized and/or found.
- (c) Clear policy for the handling and packaging of seized items.
- (d) Recording of items held by the premises and time, date and method of delivery to the Police.
- 9. Premises to actively participate in Town Centre Radio System.
- 10. The premises to actively take part in and to attend Pubwatch so long as the same exists.
- 11. When the premises operates after 23:00 hours on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays and Bank Holiday Sundays a Personal Licence Holder to be on site at all times save for in the event of an emergency.
- 12. A digital or written record shall be kept detailing all incidents that occur at the Premises, this must be completed immediately after the incident or at the latest before the staff member finishes their shift detailing the following:
- (a) The day, date and time of the incident
- (b) The member of staff making the entry.
- (c) All members of staff involved in the incident
- (d) An account of the incident
- (e) Details of any persons injured, and the injuries sustained
- (f) If Police were contacted, by what method (phone, town radio), by whom and incident number provided
- (g) Any other details thought relevant
- 13. A digital or written record by way of a refusal register will be in operation at the premises. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol will be fully trained in the system and it will record the following:
- (a) Item refused
- (b) Name of description of the person refused.
- (c) Reason for refusal.
- (d) Name of staff member making refusal
- (e) The incident and refusal registers will be available for inspection to any Police Officer or Local Authority Licensing Officer at any reasonable time.
- 14. The venue will have the following policies in place dispersal, drugs, search and evacuation and the same shall be available to West Midlands Police and the Licensing Authority upon reasonable request.
- 15. All persons employed whether paid or unpaid at the venue will have training in respect of Challenge 21, Drugs Policy, Admission Policy, Public Safety and vulnerability.

- 16. Initial training shall take place within 6 weeks of employment, training shall be refreshed every year. Records of all training shall be retained on the premises for inspection by the Police or Local Authority Licensing Officer upon reasonable request.
- 17. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
- 18. When the premises operates after 23:00 hours in respect of Fridays, Saturdays and Bank Holiday Sundays the following additional steps will be undertaken:

After 23:00 hours only one entrance will be available to members of the public.

After 23:00 hours until closure the courtyard area shall be controlled via a barrier system covering the width of the courtyard adjacent to the public highway, such area to be monitored by an SIA doorstaff

c) Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
- 2. The premises will have adequate safety and fire fighting equipment and such equipment will be maintained in good operational order.
- 3. Staff will be trained on matters of safety, evacuation and use of emergency equipment as required.
- 4. Spillages and breakages will be removed as soon as possible to reduce the risk to patrons and staff.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

- 1. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 2. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 3. The premises shall manage any queues forming outside the premises so as to not cause public nuisance or public safety issues.

e) The protection of children from harm

- 1. No person under the age of 16 shall be on the premises after 21:30 hours unless attending a pre-booked function or dining.
- 2. The premises will undertake the "Challenge 25" Scheme and it will be advertised with sufficient signage to ensure patrons are aware.
- 3. The proof of age that will be accepted by staff will be a photographic driving licence, a passport, a 'PASS' marked proof of age card, Foreign identity cards and military cards.





LICENSING ACT 2003

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE

HEARING PROCEDURE NOTE

- The Members of the Sub-committee will enter the hearing room.
- The Chair will introduce the Members of the Sub-committee and its supporting officers (normally a legal adviser and a minute taker) and will ask each of the parties (and their representatives) to identify themselves.
- The Chair will ask if the parties have received and understood the procedure note (and in particular that cross-examination by the parties is not allowed) and whether anyone present would like the procedure explained further?
- The Chair will confirm any relevant further documents the licensing authority has received before the hearing and will be considering, and will ask the parties whether there are any other documents they now wish to present (subject to the other parties' consent) and their reasons for doing so.
- The Chair will ask if any party wishes to call witnesses in support of their case and their reasons for doing so.
- The Licensing Officer will give a brief description of the application, confirm whether all relevant application formalities have been complied with and where relevant, that the authority has notified the parties of any points that the authority wanted clarification on at the hearing?
- The Chair will invite the applicant/licensee/review applicant (or representative) to present their case (maximum 20 minutes).
- The Chair will invite Members of the Sub-committee to ask the applicant/licensee/review applicant (or representative) questions.
- The Chair will invite each objector/review review respondent (or representative) to present their case (maximum 20 minutes each)
- 10. The Chair will invite Members of the Sub-committee to ask each objector/review respondent (or representative) questions.
- 11. The Chair will invite each objector/review respondent (or representative) to sum up their case and if they wish, to comment on anything said by any other party (maximum 10 minutes).
- 12. The Chair will invite the applicant/licensee/review applicant to sum up their case and if they wish, to comment on anything said by any other party (maximum 10 minutes).

- *[13. The Members of the Sub-committee will retire with their supporting officers to make their decision.
- 14 The Members of the Sub-committee and their supporting officers will return to the hearing room and the Chair will invite the Committee Solicitor to inform the meeting of the decision made, any facts relied on, the reasons for the decision and any specific legal advice given.
- 15. The Sub-committee's decision will be confirmed in a written Notice of Determination that will be issued to all parties within 5 working days of the determination.
- * Where permitted by the Act, the Chair may close the meeting at this point and re-convene the meeting in private at a later date for the Sub-committee to make its decision.

Briefing Note 7 – Hearing to Consider an Application to Review a Premises Licence

Background

A premises licence remains in force in perpetuity (unless a time-limited licence has been granted). Where the way in which the premises are being run gives rise to concerns relevant to the licensing objectives it is possible for the licence to be re-examined by the Licensing Authority. The Licensing Authority cannot review a licence of its own volition but must do so in one of two circumstances:

- (a) where a review application has been accepted from a "responsible authority" or any other person; or
- (b) where the Magistrates' Court has triggered a review following a closure order.

Where a review application is made it is served on the licensee, Responsible Authorities and is advertised by the licensing authority. Responsible Authorities or anyone else can 'join in' on the review by making their own representations.

A hearing is required to determine whether the licence should be allowed to continue or to continue with modifications.

Human Rights Act

The hearing procedure and the availability of a statutory right of appeal comply with the Article 6 requirement to provide a fair hearing when determining the licensee's and objectors' civil rights. A decision to modify, suspend or revoke a premises licence will interfere with the licensee's property rights and Article1 Protocol1 will be engaged requiring such action to be in the public interest and to be a proportional response to meeting the four licensing objectives.

The Sub-committee's powers

Having heard from the review applicant and anyone else making "relevant representations" and the licensee, the sub-committee may:

- (a) take no action; or
- (b) issue an informal warning letter; or
- (c) modify the conditions of licence*; or
- (d) exclude a licensable activity from taking place on the premises; or
- (e) remove the designated premises supervisor; or
- (f) suspend a licence for up to 3 months; or
- (a) revoke the licence.

[* controls on live or recorded music that are suspended by the Live Music Act 2012 and SI 2014/3253 can also be reintroduced at a review.]

Rights of Appeal

An aggrieved licensee can appeal to Coventry Magistrates' Court against actions (c) - (g) above and anyone else can appeal against actions (a) - (f). Any decision taken by a sub-committee does not take effect until after the period for lodging an appeal has elapsed or, where an appeal has been lodged, until the appeal is disposed of by the magistrates' court.
