

On Friday the 20<sup>th</sup> March 2015 West Midlands Police submitted paperwork requesting an expedited review of the Premises License for **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**, Croft Road, Coventry. The request followed a serious and large scale disorder outside the premises, apparently linked to a new urban event known as '**Deuce Reunited**'. This event had attracted an almost exclusively 'young, black' crowd, many of whom would have travelled into Coventry from as far afield as London. It would have been foreseeable that at the time the event ended, many individuals and groups would be left wandering the streets of the city centre, until public transport (trains & buses) became available for them to use to return home.

The serious disorder drew in approximately 40 police officers, both local to Coventry and from elsewhere across the West Midlands area. These included dog units, traffic units and officers from neighbouring Local Policing Units, who were used to assist in regaining control of the approximately 400 large crowd, which CCTV confirms emanated from **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**. CS incapacitant spray was used by at least one member of the crowd, with the discharge aimed at officers. Other participants in the disorder could be seen to use their own belts as weapons, using them to inflict injury on others within the mass of bodies on the street at that time.

At least one member of the crowd was bitten by a Police Dog, after he had attempted to assault its handler. Unfortunately an arrest did not follow, as the assailant made off into the crowd, and the Dog Handler made the risk based decision not to pursue, given the levels of indiscriminate violence being witnessed.

Another member of the crowd was subjected to a Taser deployment, as a means of gaining his compliance. This male had assaulted a police officer and was arrested as a result. A number of officers

had to draw and use their batons, and Tasers to protect themselves and other members of the public. It took officers on the night approximately 40 minutes to restore order and disperse the crowds. However, for a period of time thereafter further instances of disorder took place in the city centre, involving those who had attended **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**.

Looking at the chronology of the disorder, the Sky Dome Security made their first call to the West Midlands Police at 0119hrs following a call from John (manager) at **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** requesting urgent police assistance to close the venue down and that customers were trying to rush the door. This detail is contained within the Sky Dome Security Shift Summary (Ref ) (Exh ). A short while later Police arrived, but after speaking with Mr Kevin McCloskey (premises owner) they left the area having been assured the perceived risk had diminished.

At 0227hrs Sky Dome Security were informed by Robert Hall (DPS) for **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** that the club was over capacity and that they had over a thousand customers inside. At 0243hrs the fire alarm within **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** was activated as customers had broken it. Staff stated that they were unable to fix it due to the numbers inside the venue. Not long after, the disorder broke out.

In the statements from officers which followed the serious disorder, individuals described what they witnessed in the following ways;

*"I have been in the role of Response Officer for nine years now and have been to many public order type situations, but this was one that scared me"*

*"The level of fear I felt will stay with me for some time"*

*"The situation was tense and at times frightening. I was met with an extremely hostile and angry crowd"*

*"This incident has left me feeling shocked of how a crowd of people who were out for a night out could suddenly turn on each other and even use their own belts as weapons"*

As a result of the Expedited Review Hearing, which took place on 20 March 2015, the Licensing Sub-Committee (LSC) suspended all licensable activity at **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**, until a full hearing which



has been set for 16 April 2015.

Following the suspension of the premises license, *KRA Leisure* submitted representations to the LSC, requesting a re-determination of the decision made on 20 March 2015. West Midlands Police were made aware of this application following a personal visit by Mr McCloskey, who provided copies of the application and the proposed conditions. As a result of that visit, it was decided by me that we would generate an alternative list of conditions which – were the LSC to determine that the venue could re-open – we would ask be imposed to reduce the likelihood of a reoccurrence of the aforementioned disorder. In the spirit of openness and transparency, I agreed that we would send to Mr McCloskey a copy of our proposed conditions, and I would note any comments he might wish to make, particularly if he felt any one or more were unachievable or disproportionate to the perceived risks.

On the morning of 24 March 2015, PC Jo Bowes emailed the proposed conditions to the Coventry City Council Licensing Team, and her email included the views expressed by Mr McCloskey, emailed to me the previous evening. West Midlands Police had been afforded the opportunity to provide comments/views to the LSC, before they considered the application of Mr McCloskey. Following a meeting of the LSC on 24 March 2015, the decision was made to uphold the license suspension, pending the full hearing on 16 April 2015.

### Venue History

**Carters Sports Bar and Grill** opened to the public at the beginning of June 2014. Since then the premises has come to the attention of the West Midlands Police both in relation to concerns raised by partner organisations across the city, and more acutely following it being implicated in a number of criminal offences which have;

- Occurred within the premises or area forming part of the business premises known as **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**
- Occurred in proximity to the venue known as **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**, and has involved a victim and/or offender who was a customer within the venue immediately prior to the crime having taken place

- Involved person(s) in the direct employ of **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** and the offences have occurred in close proximity to the venue

The issue of Controlled Drugs was first highlighted at **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** during a Police operation in July 2014, following detections of cocaine found in the toilets. Advice was given to the owner about prevention within the premises. Since that time, the premises have tested positive for cocaine on numerous occasions and on the last two visits the venue has shown a significant increase in both the volume of affected areas within the venue and the apparent levels cocaine being identified (accepting the cocaine wipes being used are for indicative purposes only and are not in themselves evidential)

On a recent operation, which also involved the use of a Police Passive Drugs dog, several persons were identified as having been in possession of (actual or recent) controlled drugs. At one point during that operation, having been 'highlighted' by the dog, an attendee assaulted both the dog and his handler, before being arrested. This occurred whilst he was stood in a queue awaiting entry into **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**

In August 2014 Mr McCloskey was asked to attend a meeting with West Midlands Police and the Coventry City Council Licensing Authority, concerning proposed Irresponsible Drinks Promotions and the risks associated with them. This included an 'all-inclusive drinks offer' the venue wanted to hold. That meeting also discussed the appropriateness of the venue seeking to hold an event it wished to brand '**C.U.N.T.**'.

Concerns regarding Vulnerability have also been highlighted to the management on numerous occasions, invariably following reported offences involving customers allowed to become vulnerable as a result of their alcohol consumption, and who are then let out into public places. Their vulnerability has contributed significantly towards their subsequent victimisation or involvement in the commission of crime, which has included;

- Serious assaults (including wounding and GBH)
- Sexual assaults
- Rape
- Offences under the Public Order Act 1986
- Offences under the Theft Act 1968 (including Robbery, Theft from the Person and Theft)

- Offences under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971

Victims have been as young as 17, and many have been under the age of 20 years.

In September 2014, during a pre-planned policing operation, officers had cause to speak to Mr McCloskey about inadequate search procedures and individuals consuming drugs whilst awaiting entry into the venue. It was highlighted that the queue was not being monitored appropriately and, the approach to searching being employed by door staff was not robust or effective. On that same evening, customers leaving the venue spoke with Police officers present, and stated that it was extremely cramped inside, and the perception was the venue was operating significantly over-capacity. These concerns were then brought to the attention of Mr McCloskey.

During the same month, a student event was also organised by Mr McCloskey, which involved performances by angle grinders/fire eaters and a Bucking Bronco. The Police were not informed of this event or supplied with any risk assessment. It subsequently transpired that the event had contravened fire regulations, as well as the written agreement the venue had with The Sky Dome.

At the end of October 2014 three members of the Door Supervisor Team were reported to the SIA, following numerous reports of them using excessive force and inappropriate behaviour towards customers. During one incident, a male was forcibly ejected from the venue, thrown in a puddle and then left in the road at the side of the Sky Dome in the direct path of taxis coming and going from the nearby taxi rank. The male was unconscious when he was left, and it was only following the intervention by a member of the public who happened to be passing by and noticed the male in need of assistance, that the male was moved out of harm's way. Upon bringing this incident to the attention of **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**, the services of all three were dispensed with. However, upon examination of the Venue Incident Book, the ejection and rationale had not been recorded.

In November 2014 West Midlands Police raised concerns that door supervisors at **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** were not requesting identification on entrance to the premises. This resulted in one confirmed admission of a person under 18 to the venue, who subsequently went on to report being the victim of an Attempt Rape as a result of being targeted within the venue. Other offences of a sexual nature were reported during the same month, leading to significant concerns that females were becoming vulnerable



whilst inside the premises, and were then being targeted as a result of that vulnerability. Concerns were also growing around the numbers of underage customers gaining admittance to the venue, particularly females, as a result of the ineffective tactics being employed by door staff.

A & E data has been provided by St Johns Ambulance – which provides a commissioned health-based triage service along the Sky Dome during weekend evenings - also shows that between November 2014 and January 2015 there were 4 admissions via them to University Hospital specifically for alcohol and drugs overdoses, where the last place patients identified as having been drinking was **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**.

During December 2015, a report of sexual assault was made from a female in the premises, followed by another report in January 2015 of a female being subjected to an oral rape while inside the venue.

Since opening the premises 10 months ago there have been;


- concerns raised around the management of the premises
- concerns raised as to the effectiveness of the DPS
- a growing volume of excessively drunken customers
- a growing number of females becoming vulnerable whilst inside the premises
- an unacceptably high level of crimes occurring inside the venue, or in close proximity to the venue and involving person who have been inside the venue immediately prior to the crime taking place

During almost all of the nine months **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** have been open, one or more of the Responsible Authorities has felt it necessary to request meetings with the owners / DPS to discuss continuing and growing concerns regarding the performance of the venue. West Midlands Police have remained concerned for a considerable period of time that the management in charge of **Carters Sports Bar & Grill** do not appear to accept or act upon the advice being given regarding the management of the venue, despite advice being repeated on more than one occasion. The evidence of people becoming vulnerable whilst inside the location, coupled with the evidence surrounding the state in which many customers are being allowed to exit the premises in, all points to an ineffective management team supported by even more ineffective staff. West Midlands Police remain extremely concerned that the inability of all involved to effectively manage the premise continues to create an unacceptable level of risk

to the safety and wellbeing of patrons, staff and emergency services responding to incidents of disorder. I would therefore ask the Committee to permanently revoke the premises license for **Carters Sports Bar & Grill**.

I am Police Sergeant 4095. I am currently stationed at Coventry Central Police Station, Little Park Street, Coventry.

I wish to state that,

At approx. 01:30hrs on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2015 I was on uniformed mobile patrol in the company of PC 20554 Hemming. At this time we were answering a call to attend Carters Sports Bar, at the Sky Dome Croft Road, Coventry. Apparently there was a large group of people trying to rush the door staff in order to gain entry to the pub.

Upon our arrival all seemed calm. There was approximately 100 people queing to enter the pub and no disorder. I spoke briefly to the door staff who informed me that the group who had caused the issues had now gone. The pub was approx 100 people off their capacity and I advised them to shut their doors in order to control their admission better. I informed the Police Control of the situation via my personal radio and requested that the city centre CCTV monitor the pub for any further disorder.

At apporox. 03:40hrs we returned to Spon Street Coventry and monitored members of the public as they exited the pubs in the area. I had an unobstucted view of the concourse outside Jumping Jacks and Carters, and I could see that there was approx 400 people standing outside. Both males and females; all predominantly black.

A fight broke out outside Carters between two groups of males and officers who were standing at that end of the concourse called for other units to join them. Having alighted from my vehicle, together with PC Hemming I made my way through the crowd towards the officers. By the time we reached them the fight was over and PC 21183 Allt was advising a male. The crowd was very dense and the atmosphere was volitile. Other officers had now joined us and I told them to stay in pairs and to monitor the swelling crowd.

Another fight broke out approx 10ms from where I was standing and the crowd surged towards it. I could not

see what was happening until I saw a male fall to the ground having been tasered by PC 4031 Gibbs.

I was later informed that this male had been involved a fight where another one of my officers had been punched in the face.

The crowd became extremely hostile and began shouting at the officers as they struggled with the male on the floor in an attempt to handcuff him. I ordered my remaining officers to draw their batons and hold the crowd back in an attempt to create a safe distance between them and us. This had the desired affect and the officers were able to safely detain the prisoner and escort him to their vehicle. The crowd were pushing at the officers and their demeanour was very hostile and aggressive.

Other members of the crowd by this point had removed their belts from around their waists and were now using them as weapons to attack each other. There were three or four sporadic fights breaking out and myself and my remaining eight officers did our best to break them up. I am aware that several members of the public were injured during these fights but non of the attackers were clearly identified and the victims themselves were part of the affray taking place; and did not wish to engage with officers.

At one satge a vehicle containing a group of males attempted to leave the Sky Dome carpark. There was some suggestion that these males had been involved in the fighting and were now surrounded by an angry mob who were hitting the vehicle and climbing on the roof. Suddenly there was an explosion and a large plume of CS gas was released around the vehicle. Some one had let off a CS canister and the crowd moved away from the vehicle allowing it to continue on its journey at speed away from the scene. I was unable to identify the vehicle registration due to the amount of people surrounding the car before it made off.

Eventually we managed to gain control of the situation and depite being greatly outnumbered, we dispersed the crowd away from the scene.

There were no further incidents following this action.

It is unclar what provoked the violence. It obviously involved the customers of Carters Sports Bar and I can only presume that the hostility began between the different groups within the pub during the night.

It should be noted within this report that if it had not been for the courage of the attending officers in dealing with an extremely hostile overwhelming crowd; the list of casualties and serious injuries would have been considerably greater.

I am Police Constable 4031 GIBBS of The west Midlands Police based at Coventry Central Police Station.

On Friday 20th March 2015 I was in full street uniform and in company with PC 21183 ALLT using the call sign Charlie Victor Oscar Two zero. We had been deployed to a location that I know as Carters sports bar at The Skydome complex in the city centre. This was as a result of the location closing for the evening and there being in excess of four hundred subjects on "the concourse" and the CCTV room identifying the fact that this may lead to disorder.

We had been patrolling the area for a short time and the crowds were large but generally in good spirits. However this soon changed, verbal abuse seemed to increase between people within the crowd and the mood seemed to turn aggressive. We began to see males in the location approaching each other in a fashion that I can only describe as aggressive. In my own words I would say that they were "SQUARING UP TO EACH OTHER", approaching each other and shouting with clenched fists and in an aggressive manner.

Just after 04:00hrs on the same day and date I informed the control room via my airwave terminal that we may require other Officers at our location. Just after making this transmission a fight broke out, the large crowd around our marked Police vehicle surged forwards towards the front of "CARTERS SPORTS BAR", myself and PC ALLT then left the vehicle and approached the crowd. I could see people with bottles being used as weapons and others removing their belts, these people were wrapping one end around their hand and leaving the buckles hanging at the other end. I truly believed that the situation was now turning into something far worse than I first anticipated.

Statement of Nathan Peter GIBBS

The group that seemed to be fighting moved into the front of Carters and ended up caught in an alcove to the right hand side (looking at the front). Numerous blows were being thrown and bottles were thrown into the mêlée. Myself and PC ALLT were still alone but were in a position where we could not withdraw and had multiple subjects in front of us fighting. We used open handed tactics at first pushing people back and trying to prevent any further fighting. PC ALLT managed to detain a male who seemed to be at the centre of this disorder. As he did this I was behind and to his left trying to keep the crowd back, this hostile crowd then began to surge towards us and given the situation, my fear for our safety and the fact that we were still the only Officers I could see in the location I drew my Taser. I aimed the taser into the crowd of people in front of me and illuminated the red dot laser sight and began shouting "GET BACK! GET BACK NOW!" at first the crowd seemed not to notice given their clear intention to join in the disorder but soon and following more verbal commands from myself they withdrew. We were then able to stand our ground and I was aware other Officers had arrived at the location. There were no offences disclosed by people with us at the location and PC ALLT obtained details of a male who we had detained. I saw an IC3 male with a dark jacket walk away from us with blood on his face and called out to him but he looked at me and moved faster away from me. I did not wish to leave PC ALLT alone so did not follow this male. I am unaware if this male has come forward or made nay complaint at this stage.

As we stood in the corner the crowd continued to be aggressive and hostile towards us and each other. I wanted us to join up with other Officers so as to increase our effectiveness in sorting the situation and also to improve our own safety. The large crowd seemed to be moving fast all around us and I heard other Officers say that there were further pockets of fighting. To my right I could see members of the crowd again starting to fight each other and I was aware of the fact that Officers were in the same situation myself and PC ALLT had been in, being outnumbered by subjects and that these subjects were using improvised weapons against each other.

Using the information around me I began to assess the situation again wanting to get all of the Officers present together so that we could consider our options and deal with the situation effectively. The disorder seemed to continue and the crowd did d not move away, it seemed to be out of control. I saw PC 21836 COLVIN was isolated and engaged with a number of subjects all of whom were fighting with each other and from where I stood it looked like they were also engaging PC COLVIN. I noticed that PC COLVIN had his casco drawn and was using it in what I would refer to as a "clearing strike" to keep subjects at bay. One of the group in front of him looked to be attacking him directly. This male was taller and more powerfully built than PC COLVIN and did not look to be afraid of the casco strikes that he was employing.

With this in mind and my fear for PC COLVINS safety I unholstered my Taser and approached him shouting "GET BACK! GET BACK!". Some of the group began to move but the male in front of PC COLVIN continued, I saw him kick and punch several people as I approached and he again turned on PC COLVIN. I reassessed the situation and felt that we were all in danger, there were too few of us and too many aggressive subjects. My next choice was one that I made with Common Law in mind and I aimed my Taser at the subject in front of PC COLVIN and illuminated the red dot laser sight shouting at the male to get back. The male turned towards me and began to approach me. I truly believed that this male was about to engage me in a physical confrontation so I shouted "TASER, TASER!" and deployed it as a pre-emptive strike. I had already consider other options but felt that the use of my CS spray would have been ineffective given the close proximity to the subject and also PC COLVIN and that this may not have subdued the subject before he had time to engage me. I also felt that to draw my casco was not going to work as I had already seen this subject engaged in a physical confrontation and had seen that he had not stopped when confronted with an Officer already armed with a "racked" casco. Even though I felt confident to engage the subject in open handed tactics I felt that this may not be appropriate due to the fact that this would then channel my attention to him and him alone. The choice to deploy the Taser was one I made with keeping me on my feet, and maintaining my spatial awareness and allowing me to see if any other subjects approached me or the other Officers around me.

I made my deployment and the subject continued to move. The probes made good contact with his upper body on both arms and I believe N.M.I was good however he continued to run and I had to extend the deployment and follow him as he ran. After a short while the subject fell to the ground and myself and other Officers were then able to restrain him and place him into handcuffs to the rear in a Home Office approved manner. The subject was instantly calm, he spoke to me and when I asked him "ARE YOU OK? YOU HAVE JUST BEEN TASERED" he replied "I'M GOOD, IT HURTS BUT I'M GOOD" he made no further attempt to resist or any sort of attempt to lash out at anyone and was completely compliant. He was sat up and then helped to his feet and taken to my marked vehicle and placed in the rear. I was then able to say "I'M ARRESTING YOU ON SUSPICION OF AN ASSAULT" and "CAUTION, THIS IS FOR THE PROMPT AND EFFECTIVE INVESTIGATION OF THE OFFENCE AND ALSO TO PREVENT FURTHER INJURY TO ANYONE", HE MADE NO REPLY TO THIS. We were then able to take him into custody where I relayed the details of his arrest to the custody Sergeant and his detention was authorised. MA/1839/15 refers

I was later able to complete this statement that now forms my notes of this incident.

PC 4031 GIBBS

My own VPS.

Given the fact that we had been deployed to the area prior to things taking a turn for the worse I witnessed numerous people become aggressive and violent towards each other. We were in a position where the sheer number of people in the street prevented me from driving my vehicle away from the situation which I would like to say would have been my first choice in order to allow other officers to join us before attempting to break up the disorder or arrest offenders and deal with any victims.

The large crowd was initially full of people that looked like they were enjoying the evening but turned hostile very very quickly. I have been in the role of response Officer for nine years now and have been in many public order type situations but this was one that scared me. The fact that it changed so rapidly and the fact that our resources were immediately stretched to the point of almost ineffectiveness just placed all of us in dangerous situations that we could have avoided if we had more numbers and had been made aware of the event and in turn been able to plan for it and any eventuality.

Many subjects within the crowd armed themselves with improvised weapons VERY quickly, this alarmed me, the fact that the people involved were prepared to arm themselves and engage in physical confrontations even with a Police presence has scared me.

Our role as response Officers is often a challenge but I personally feel that tonight was out of control very quickly and the scope for injuries to Officers became massive. I was surprised that none of us were hurt.

To be stood in a crowd of hostile people with no clear view of any other Officers other than my partner is a situation I did not relish. The level of fear I felt will stay with me for some time. To see people openly fighting with various types of weapons and show no regard for the safety of anyone in the area is haunting.

I am Police constable 4245 HOWES of the West Midlands Police. I am a Police dog handler currently stationed at Canley Police Station with Police Dog 4295 Mambo. Police Dog Mambo and I successfully completed an initial training course in July 2012, and were licensed in accordance with the standards laid down by the Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO) Committee on Police Dog Training. A structured programme of Refresher Training has been maintained throughout the working life of the dog, and evidenced against specific Units of Assessment, identified within the ACPO Training and care Manual for General Purpose Police Dogs. Annual licensing of the dog and handler is part of that process. Records of those assessments are contained within my Personal development Profile and are available for examination if required.

On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2015 at 04.06 hours I was on full uniform mobile patrol in company with PD Mambo. At this time I responded to a backup call from other officers at CARTERS SPORTBAR AND GRILL, THE SKYDOME COVENTRY. Officers stated that fights were developing and that they had drawn their Tasers.

On arrival 04.09 hours I parked my vehicle in CROFT ROAD near to a burger van. I could see that there was a large group of mainly black young males, some standing in the road and others on the concourse. As officers were vastly outnumbered I removed PD Mambo from the rear of my van on a lead. I took him near to the front of the burger van that was to my right and let him bark as a visual deterrent. I was then made aware via personal radio that males were taking off belts to use as weapons and that CS spray had been deployed by someone in the crowd. Officers were asked to remain in pairs for their safety.

My attention was then drawn to a group of approximately 4 – 5 black males. One being approximately 6ft tall, stocky build approximately 20 years of age and wearing a white shirt. He along with others ran towards another group of males and started fighting in the middle of the road. I could see that punches and kicks were being thrown towards this other group. They also began to throw punches and kicks. I ran towards this group and shouted, "POLICE OFFICER WITH A DOG."

The group totally ignored me and appeared totally intent in fighting each other. I then deployed PD Mambo into the group to disperse them. He targeted the male in the white shirt and lunged forward towards this male, however I was not certain that he had bitten this male or anyone else.

Another male I would describe as black, aged 18-20, slim build wearing a shiny grey jacket ran in front of me and started fighting another male. I managed to pull him back with my free hand to stop him fighting. As I pulled him back he appeared to lash out with his right arm towards me. PD Mambo defended me by biting the male on his right upper arm, the male fell to the ground.

To prevent any further injury I gave PD Mambo the release command and he released immediately. This male then got to his feet and ran off into the crowd. Due to the vast numbers, the continuing violence, for my own and the other officers safety (I was the only dog handler deployed at this time to the incident) I was unable to pursue this male. I remained at my position and immediately informed Coventry and the Force control room that PD Mambo had bitten an unknown black male.

I am PC 21836 Carl COLVIN currently attached to Response Team E based at Coventry Central Police Station.

This statement is about an incident that occurred on Friday 20th MARCH 2015 at around 0410 Hours where I attended CARTERS SPORTS BAR located at the SKY DOME COMPLEX in Coventry City Centre to a report of disorder to which I was also punched in the face and exposed to CS Spray.

On Friday 20th March 2015 at 0408 Hours I was on duty in uniform in company with PC 20156 BRENNAN call sign CVM 61 when a call was received via my airwave terminal of a disorder at CARTERS SPORTS BAR and officers needed help at the location.

At 0410 HOURS and PC 20156 BRENNAN arrived at the Sky Dome concourse to which I would estimate around 300 people were outside CARTERS SPORTS BAR.

As I exited the police vehicle I could hear lots of shouting from various sections of the crowd and their appeared to be what I felt a very aggressive atmosphere in the air.

I would estimate at that point there was around 300 people on the concourse.

I then shouted at a group to stop fighting to which they were ignoring my commands and started to take there belts off and hit each other with them.

Other units then arrived to which we were vastly out numbered.

At that point I was punched on the right side of my face by an unknown person to which I felt pain and discomfort for around 3 to 4 seconds.

Whoever hit me had disappeared into the crowd as It happened very quickly before I could react.

Other members of the crowd then appeared to come towards me in an aggressive manor to which I became very scared and thought I was going to be attacked.

Due to this I felt it was NECASSARY under Common Law and Section 117 of PACE to draw my Casco in order to defend myself as I felt an assault on myself and colleagues was immanent.

Other officers at the location also drew there cascos.

An IC3 Male then approached me who was very large built and around 6 feet tall in an aggressive manor to which I thought he was going to attack me, I then struck the IC3 male to his thigh area using my Casco performing a cutting strike as this has been thought to me in various PST courses as an home office approved method to which it was effective.

At this stage other IC 3 males approached me in an aggresive manor some of which I could see belts wrapped around there hands, due to this I was again in fear for my personal saftey and used my casco to perform cutting stikes to keep these males at bay due to a fear of myself and colleagues being assaulted.

I then could see PC 4031 GIBBS come to my aid with his taser drawn and appeared to taser one of the very aggressive IC3 Males who came towards me.

Myself and PC 4031 GIBBS then had to run after the IC3 male as the taser appeared to have no effect, PC 4031 GIBBS then caught up with the male to which I gave assistance to PC 4031 GIBBS in arresting the male.

My attention was then drawn to another group of IC3 males this time who were jumping on a vehicle and were attacking the driver.

As I approached the vehicle I was met with a sudden stinging sensation to which I immediately recognised as CS spray as I have been exposed to this during my police service both in active service and training and are fully aware of its effects.

This exposure left me feeling sick to which I was coughing, my nose was streaming and my eyes were stinging.

After around 5 minutes the crowd began to withdraw to which I along with my colleagues remained on the concourse in order to maintain a visible police presence.

After around half an hour the Concourse was quite with few people on it to which I was then tasked to attend the BURGESS in order to keep an eye on MCDONALD's restaurant as many of the crowd from CARTERS had arrived there in order to purchase food.

At that stage the effects of the CS had fully worn off and I had no pain or discomfort to my face.

Myself and PC 20156 BRENNAN were then diverted to an immediate response to which I was not in position to fully discuss myself being assaulted with my supervisor until today.

I did not receive any medical attention as it was only momentary pain and discomfort.

I wish to make a formal complaint of assault on myself and am willing to attend court if needed, I also give West Midlands Police access to my medical records if required.

In 5 years 2 months of Service with West Midlands Police and 4 years as a Special Constable with Warwickshire Police the incident at the Sky Dome on 20th March 2014 was the worst disorder I have ever attended, I have in my service attended football matches with some disorder but I have never felt more in fear for my own and that of my colleagues safety that night.

Some elements of the crowd were completely oblivious to police instructions and were intent on fighting with one another and were willing to use their own belts as weapons.

This incident has left me feeling shocked of how a crowd of people who were out for a night out could suddenly turn on each other and even use their own belts as weapons, I have never been assaulted on duty whilst serving with West Midlands Police to which I feel shocked and also upset because I was at the location to help members of the public by maintaining law and order and keep people safe to which a member of the public has placed it upon themselves to what in my opinion is a cheap shot and punch me in the face, I am also upset that I was exposed to CS gas which also came from a member of the public leaving me feeling vulnerable.

I believe the owners of CARTERS SPORTS BAR have some serious questions to ask of how an event hosted by themselves could spiral out of control to which police officers and members of the public were exposed to risk.

My staff members will state that they feel intimidated and vulnerable at times. They are often dealing with people who are drunk and impatient and can be very verbally aggressive. Due to this I provide security staff and we have a 'staff safe' this is a panic button where by when it is activated the aggressor is warned that the Police are coming and to move away from the vicinity.

Following Urban Nights large crowds seem to congregate outside and inside the store. Sometimes the crowds can become volatile and my security staff will put measures in place to manage the situation.
