**Mandatory Conditions**

**Section 19 Licensing Act 2003**

Where this licence authorises the supply of alcohol,

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the licence:**
  - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor (DPS) in respect of the licence, or**
  - b. at a time when the DPS does not hold a personal licence or that licence is suspended**
  
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence**

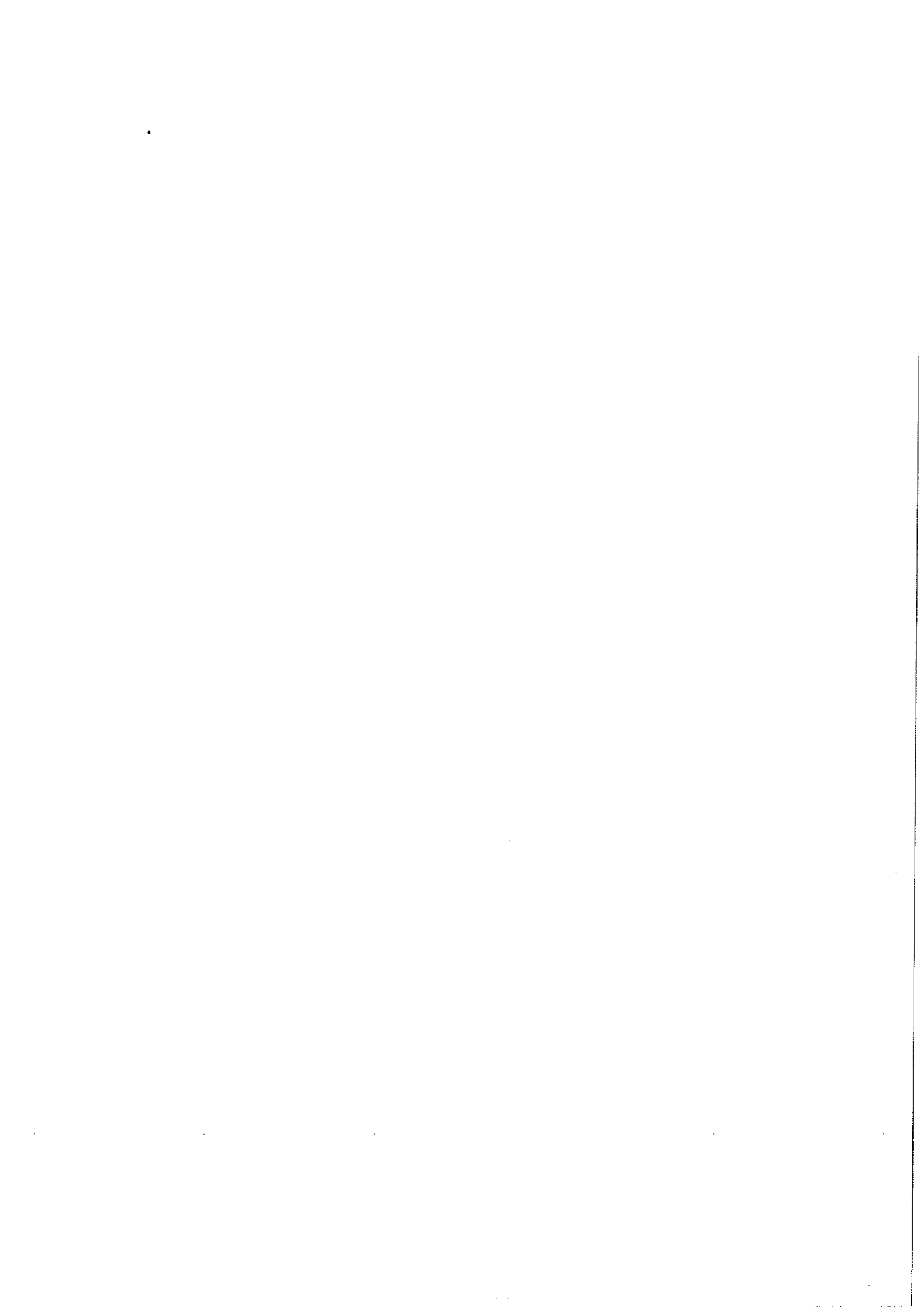
**Section 20 Licensing Act 2003**

Where this licence authorises the exhibition of films,

- (1) the admission of children to the exhibition of any film will be restricted.**
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless otherwise stated, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.**
- (3) Where :**
  - i. the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or**

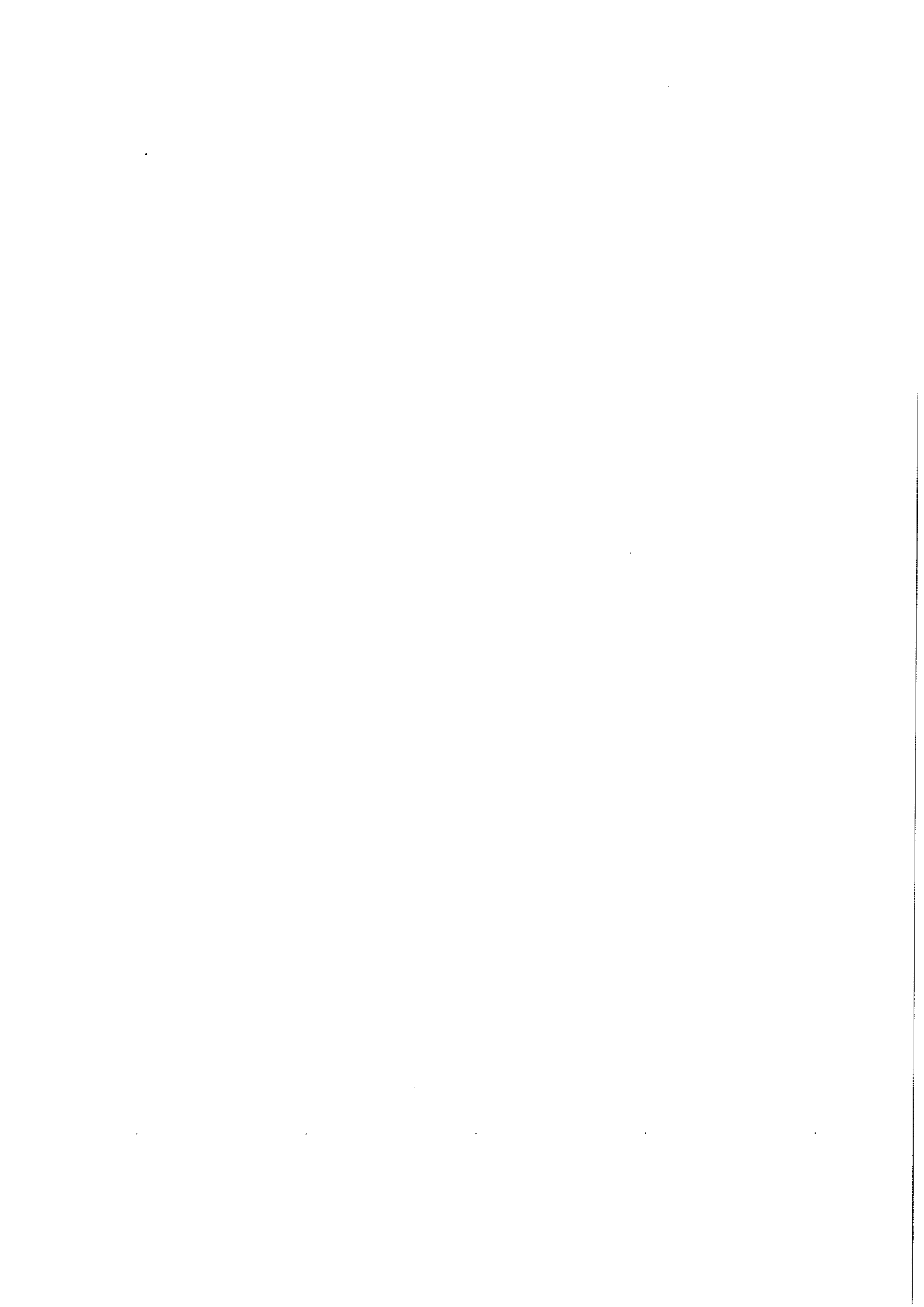

- \* A rigid policy where bar staff DO NOT SERVE persons believed to be under age:  
Operate a 'proof of age' scheme - Documentary evidence required.  
Cause for concern - Considered to be under the influence of excessive alcohol.

**c) Public safety**

Have procedures and practices in place that promote and enhance safe socialising.

RISK ASSESSMENTS (Working environment) with Training initiatives for employees  
(Premises) Ensuring a safe and pleasant socialising environment

FIRE Evacuation procedures - Frequent testing of Emergency Alarm & Lighting system

Health and Safety relating to the supply of food provisions.

Have staff training that allow them to recognise when 'drugs' are being handled or used.

Preventing UNDER AGE DRINKING and promoting SENSIBLE DRINKING HABITS.

Instil a regime that encourages people when leaving the premises to be quiet and orderly thus causing little to no disturbance to the neighbouring residents.

Make announcements over the PA system to encourage people to leave premises quietly.

Have adequate lighting outside that illuminates paths and walkways to roads and car park.

When music is catered for, make sure that doors and windows facing towards the neighbouring residents are closed. Notify artistes of our sound level control system and to comply with it.

Request people do not park in front of private dwellings causing obstruction to local residents.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

Have a policy that Children remain under the control of their parents/guardians at ALL times  
Children will not be served at the bars where alcohol is available.

Signage to display NO GO AREAS for children and not to leave the premises unattended.

No persons under the age of 18 to participate in playing BINGO or any other activity solely for the purpose of winning money as a prize.

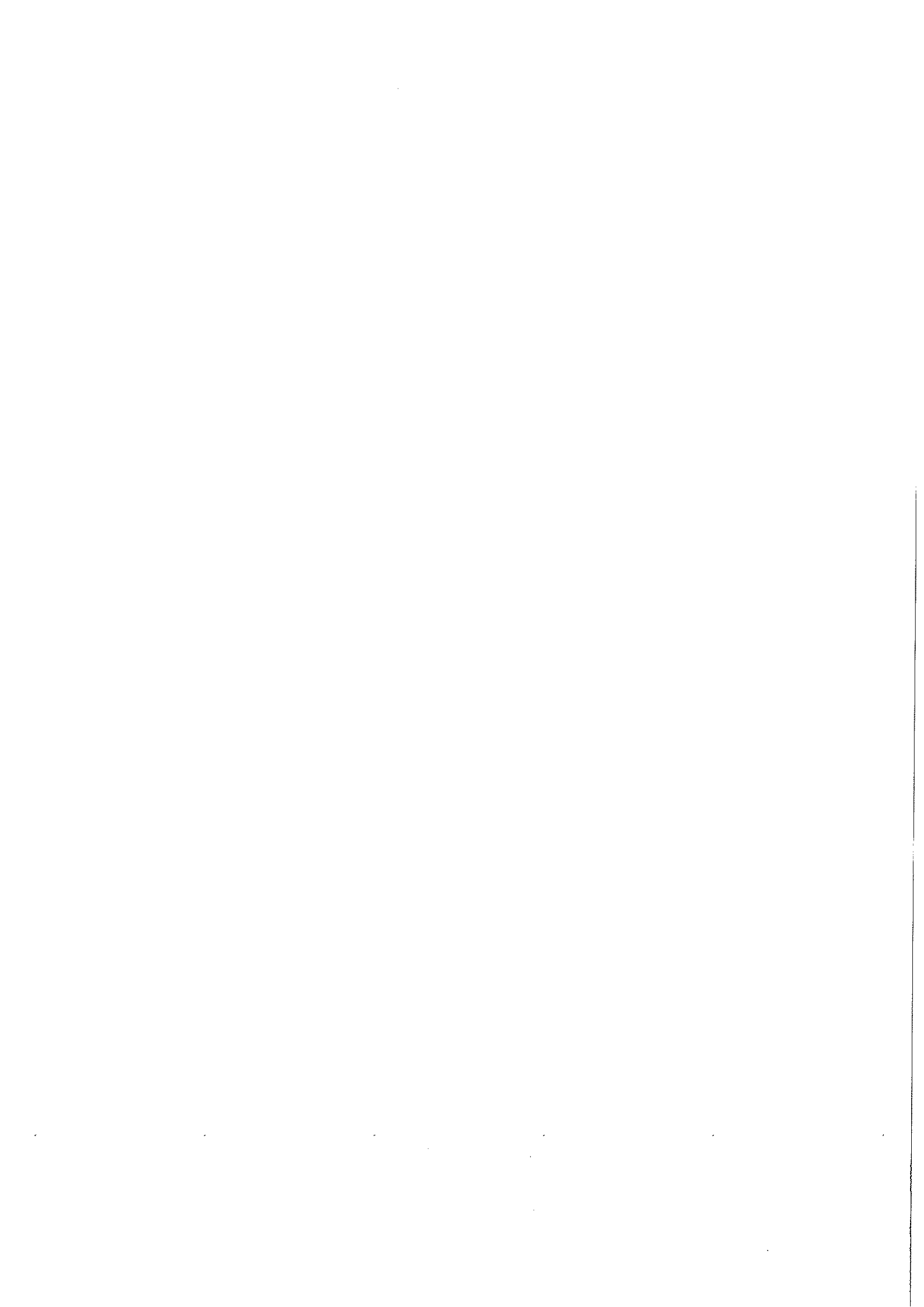
Where and when possible, members are encouraged to monitor children and report to committee any activity that's likely to cause concern or lead to some form of injury while on the premises.

Club policy is that any children while on club premises are under the control and responsibility of the their parents or guardians at all times.

### **Conditions Attached after a Hearing by the Licensing Authority**

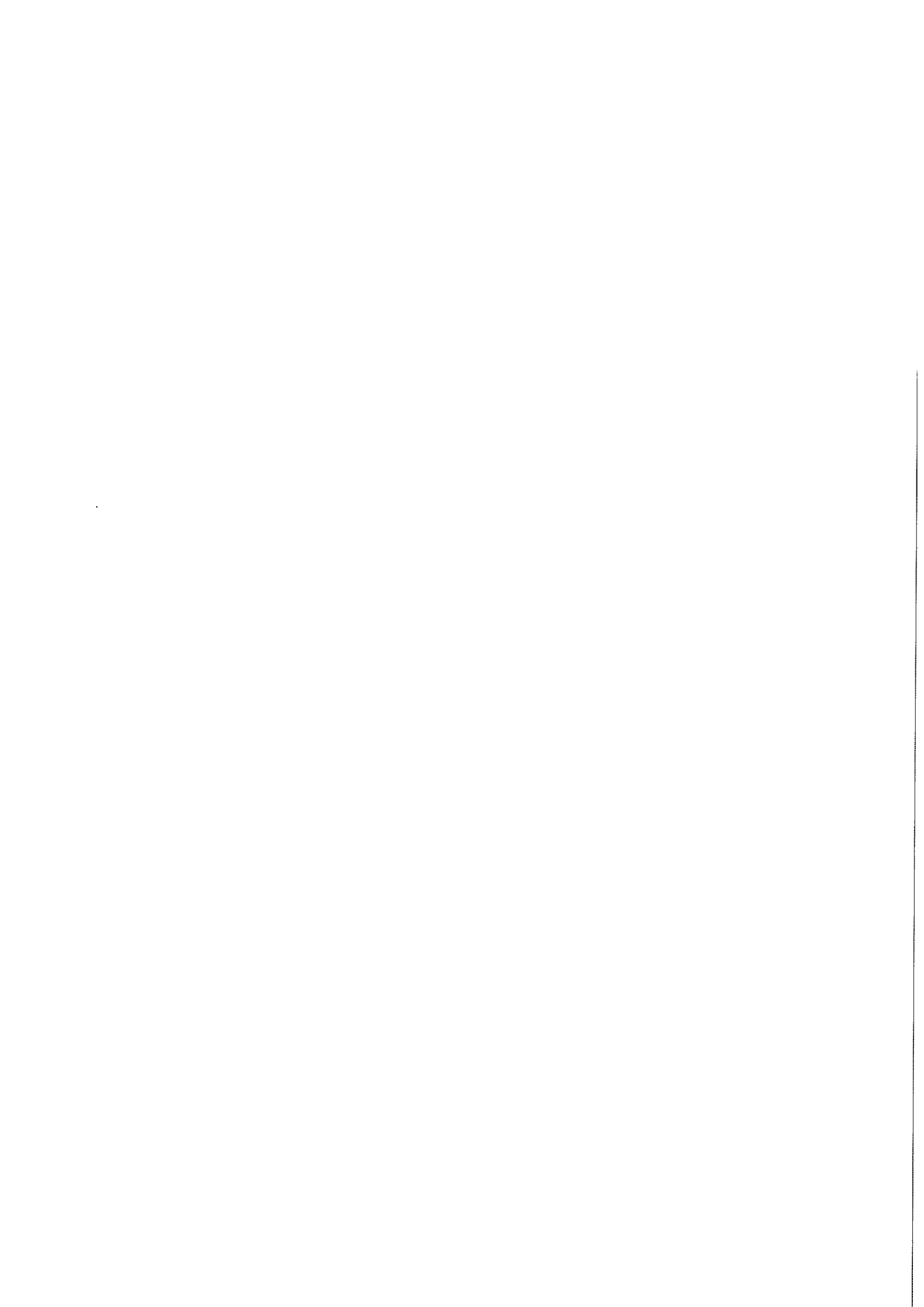
