#### 1. Recommendation

The purpose of this report is to provide feedback on MIPIM 2015, as approved by the Cabinet Member (Business, Enterprise and Employment) meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2015.

Scrutiny Board 3 is asked to:

Note the outcomes of MIPIM 2015.

Recommend to the Cabinet Member (Business, Enterprise and Employment) that Coventry City Council attends MIPIM 2016, with the continued aspiration, of a Private Sector partnership, meeting the entire project costs.

#### 2. Background

This year marked the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Europe's largest and most successful property conference/exhibition – MIPIM. With over 21,000 delegates, including some 4,500 investors from over 89 countries MIPIM continues to host the largest annual gathering of international property leaders.

The primary objective of the Coventry and Warwickshire presence is to attract and encourage investment into the area, raise the area's international image and demonstrate Coventry and Warwickshire is in the marketplace for business and new property investment.

#### 2.1 "Coventry and Warwickshire @ MIPIM Partnership"

MIPIM 2007 saw the launch of the Coventry@MIPIM partnership, a private sector partnership instigated and led by Coventry City Council which has helped ensure a coordinated approach, sharing of the costs across the private sector and a higher profile for the city at MIPIM.

MIPIM 2015 key partners included: Coventry and Warwickshire Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP), Friargate Coventry LLP, Jaguar Land Rover, Barberry, Deloitte Real Estate, Study Inn, University of Warwick, MIRA, Coventry University, Coventry & Warwickshire Development Partnership, Wasp's, Coventry Core, and McLaren.

Associate partners included: Complex Development Projects, Deeley, and Shortland Penn + Moore.

Although the wider region and Warwickshire has had a strong presence with Coventry in previous years (through the presence of the LEP) Warwickshire County Council took part in the MIPIM for the first time this year with Cllr Izzie Secombe, Leader of the Council, Cllr June Tandy, Leader of the Labour Group, Mark Ryder, Head of Economic Growth, Monica Fogarty, Strategic Director for Communities and Sackie Somal Inward Investment Manager attending.

#### 2.2 **Private Sector Sponsorship**

The MIPIM 2015 partners' sponsorship contributions for MIPIM 2015 totalled £188,204.22. The value of third party sponsorship achieved this year ensured that MIPIM 2015 incurred no costs to Coventry City Council.

#### 2.3 **Coventry and Warwickshire's programme of activity**

#### 2.3.1 **Coventry and Warwickshire exhibition stand**



New, more stringent rules and regulations introduced by exhibition organisers this year, Reed Midem, required the partnership to use a larger exhibition space than previous years. This incurred extra costs and the need for a larger staff presence to manage the stand.

The stand was designed and coordinated using a 'Fast Track' theme profiling the Coventry and Warwickshire offer. Elements

included a private meeting room, location maps and an interactive 'Scalextric' track where visitors had the opportunity to race Jaguar cars around the 'ring road' track which featured development opportunities.



Four events took place on the stand during the conference which attracted large numbers and widespread attention.

A suite of invitations were created using the 'fast track' theme (Appendix 2 of the report)

2.3.3 Coventry and Warwickshire Business Lounge - No. 3 La Croisette



The "Coventry and Warwickshire @ MIPIM partnership" rented an apartment in a prime location, directly opposite the main exhibition hall and highly visible branding was used to promote "The Coventry and Warwickshire Business Lounge".



The business lounge was used as a location for events and business meetings by members of the partnership. Plasma screens were located within the business lounge and the adapted Coventry and Warwickshire show reel was played continuously. A total of four events were held in the apartment including 'Investor Roundtable – setting the scene @ MIPIM for Coventry & Warwickshire', 'Coventry & Warwickshire LEP Welcome Reception', 'Oxford Intelligence Inward Investment Briefing' and 'Key Cities – The UK untapped development opportunities'. (Appendix 2)

More than 130 people visited the apartment to attend business meetings or events.

The apartment also provided accommodation for four members of the Coventry City Council team.

#### 2.3.4 Events Programme

During the four day MIPIM 2015 conference/exhibition, the Coventry and Warwickshire partnership hosted 12 events, four being held on the Coventry and Warwickshire exhibition stand, five in the Business Lounge, two off sites and one on the Birmingham exhibition stand.

#### Investors Roundtable – Setting the Scene @ MIPIM for Coventry & Warwickshire: Tuesday 10 March, Coventry & Warwickshire Business Lounge, No 3 La Croisette

A facilitated roundtable discussion chaired and facilitated by Jackie Sadek, Chief Executive of UK Regeneration, with invited investors and funders from the South.

The politics reporter from BBC Coventry & Warwickshire was invited to film the event and also interviewed Jackie Sadek at the end of the event.

### Coventry & Warwickshire LEP Welcome Reception: Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March, Coventry & Warwickshire Business Lounge, No 3 La Croisette

Sponsored by Coventry & Warwickshire LEP with 30 guests including MIPIM 2015 partners. The politics reporter from BBC Coventry & Warwickshire filmed the event and interviewed members of the Partnership during the event.

# Oxford Intelligence Inward Investment Briefing: MIPIM 2015: Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March Coventry & Warwickshire Business Lounge, No 3 La Croisette

A breakfast presentation in partnership with Oxford Intelligence; a leader in the provision of consulting and quality business information to international businesses and government agencies.

Martin Reeves chaired the event, profiling Coventry & Warwickshire as an exemplar area for growth and regeneration opportunities. A total of 30 guests attended the event

# Coventry University Signing Ceremony: Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March on the Coventry & Warwickshire Exhibition Stand P-1.F82

The signing of Coventry University's largest and most significant development since it was founded. The event gained positive international coverage.

### HS2 Linking Cities to Investment: Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March on the Greater Birmingham Exhibition Stand R7 B12

The panel discussion, around strategies for growth, was chaired by Andy Street, Chief Executive of John Lewis. Speakers included, Martin Reeves, Mark Rogers Chief Executive of Birmingham City Council, Nick Page Chief Executive of Solihull MBC and Sir Michael Bear Chairman of UKTI Regeneration Investment Organisation.

#### Key Cities – The UK untapped Development Opportunities: Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March Coventry & Warwickshire Business Lounge, No 3 La Croisette

Key Cities was founded by the councils of Coventry, Derby, Preston, Sunderland and Wakefield and now has 26 member cities from across England and Wales. Cllr Lucas welcomed guests on behalf of the Leader of Sunderland Council and presented the opportunities that key cities, such as Coventry, can offer to investors and developers. A total of 29 guests attended.

A private dinner sponsored by the Friargate Coventry LLP Team focused on the Coventry & Warwickshire Growth agenda and highlighting major schemes planned or underway. A total of 30 were present during the evening.

Sponsored by Jaguar Land Rover, providing a networking opportunity with 140 guests. Jaguar Land Rover vehicles were displayed outside the venue and WASPs players supported the event.

#### 2.3.5 Meetings Programme

A total of 165 meetings took place over the four days. Meetings were held with senior representatives from key property companies, developers, intermediaries and end users within the property sector. All contacts made at MIPIM 2015 continue to be followed up.

Dependent upon the nature of the enquiry a number of follow-up actions have already taken place, including meetings with major property development companies, funders and intermediaries. Other clients have received specific/tailored business case data, attended specific site visits, received generic information, and/or have been added to relevant contact databases. Members and Senior Officers also attended 'invitation only' events during MIPIM 2015 (Appendix 4).

#### 3. Cost of attending

The total costs against the Coventry and Warwickshire presence at MIPIM 2015 was  $\pounds 172,466.68$ . Third party funds secured were in excess of the total costs which resulted in a carry forward of  $\pounds 15,737.54$  which will be used to support MIPIM 2016.

#### 4. Benefits

The primary objective of Coventry and Warwickshire's involvement is to attract and encourage investment into the area as part of an overall strategy to create and sustain jobs in the region. Participating and exhibiting at MIPIM allows Coventry and Warwickshire the opportunity to profile projects, achievements and development opportunities to major decision makers and intermediaries in the UK and international property markets.

MIPIM 2015 has already secured important and ongoing discussions with key contacts on retail development, investment funding and hotel development within the city.

#### 4.1 **Partners Feedback**

Due to the confidential nature of our partners' client discussions, partners will not disclose full specifics of contracts and deals discussed/secured until they have been finalised which in the property world can take months or years. A summary of feedback:

The organisers demand to increase the size and activity within the Palais in our view, was right and was rewarded by increased 'chance' visits by delegates, while the apartment facility continued to provide a super base for discrete and confidential meetings.

#### Nick Eastwood, Wasps:

"We attended MIPIM for the first time in 2015 and found the whole event extremely useful. From our own point of view, we made a number of key contacts with senior important individuals. The simple fact is that we made those contacts in two days when, in the normal course of business, it could well have taken six months (or even not at all).

"Based on that alone, we intend to be there next year. From Coventry and Warwickshire's perspective, it seems to me non-negotiable that the region is properly and professionally represented at an event where the key decisions on inward investment begin to be formulated.

#### 4.2 **PR**

Advent Communications was contracted to work for the Coventry and Warwickshire MIPIM Partnership through its work with the Coventry and Warwickshire Place Board.

The company has worked at MIPIM for close to a decade and has a strong network of media contacts in the property sector and has deal with many of our key partners over several years.

That experience paid dividends at this year's MIPIM in several ways, including a week of space in the Coventry and Warwickshire Telegraph by providing worthwhile stories ahead of the MIPIM week, as well as daily blogs to appear on the Coventry Telegraph website.

The BBC decided – through its Politics Show – to send a reporter to shadow Coventry and Warwickshire to see why cities and councils attend the event.

The decision to announce the Coventry University/City Council deal during MIPIM gave the week the focal point of a major deal which ensured widespread press interest – including international coverage.

The two leading property publications, leading websites and the MIPIM News covered the story.

The story also featured in a major MIPIM supplement which was put out through the Coventry Telegraph and Birmingham Post after the event.

#### 4.4 **Recommendation to attend MIPIM 2016**

MIPIM 2015 was considered to be the most positive and productive MIPIM to date. This can be evidenced by the partners' feedback in section 4.1 of this report, with zero cost to Coventry City Council.

It is proposed that Coventry City Council attends MIPIM 2016, with the continued aspiration of a Private Sector partnership meeting all of the project costs.

Given its prestigious location, the unrivalled branding opportunity it presents and the excellent feedback from the partners, it is recommended that Coventry re-secure the apartment (No. 3 La Croisette) for use by the Coventry and Warwickshire Partnership at MIPIM 2015 immediately.

It is also recommended that a Coventry and Warwickshire exhibition stand is secured as soon as possible to secure the 'best' location within the main exhibition hall. Furthermore, officer's hotel accommodation can only be secured following receipt of the signed exhibition stand contract.

A Travel Approval request will be submitted to Cabinet Member as soon as possible

#### 4.5 **Improvements to maximise any future MIPIM presence**

Following the excellent feedback from Warwickshire County Council, MIPIM 2016 will be developed as part of a cross team approach. A cohesive and joined up approach should in turn encourage further regional support from sub-regional private sector partners.

The Automotive event, 'The West Midlands – Home of UK automotive from research to the road' in partnership with Marketing Birmingham generated a great deal of interest and allowed the opportunity to promote the city's collaborative regional approach. The team will work alongside the exhibition organiser's Reed Midem to look into the opportunity of hosting a regional event as part of the main conference programme – which tends to attract large international audiences.




