Report 5 Drapers Hall Refurbishment Proposal

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Business, Enterprise & Employment) is recommended to:

- 1. Approve the contribution of Drapers Hall to the project at nil consideration as per the red line boundary on the attached plan in Appendix 1 for the purposes of delivering the project proposal, subject to Executive Directors Place and Resources satisfaction with the funding arrangements and a sustainable financial business plan.
- Subject to satisfaction with the funding arrangements and sustainability of the financial business plan, approve the Council entering into the necessary legal documents to implement the project this would include a Building Lease to undertake works, a long lease at a peppercorn of the restored building and ancillary land (exact area to be defined by planning consent) and the grant of a licence to use and maintain public open space.

3. Approve Council support for a Highways Stopping Up Order as per the red line boundary on the attached plan in Appendix 2 for the purposes of delivering the project proposal.

- iv. Encourages partners to identify ways of supporting SMEs to work with the universities to innovate and invest in research and development

Report 5 Petition and Consultation Results – Daventry Road Improvement Scheme

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to:

- 1. Note the concerns and suggestions of the petitioners and consultees.
- 2. Approve implementation of the revised scheme (indicative layout shown in Appendix C).

3. Subject to the approval of recommendation 2 above, approve the use of an experimental Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to close the exit from the service road on to Quinton Road to enable the situation to be monitored.

The above recommendations were approved.

NOTE:

In accordance with paragraph 4.5.27 of the Constitution, Councillor Clifford, as the nominee of the Chair of Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee, attended the Cabinet Member (Public Services) meeting and agreed the need for urgency such that call-in arrangements will not apply. The reason for urgency is that the works must be completed before 23rd March 2014 when Warwick Road is due to be closed for approximately 12 months in connection with the Friargate development. Quinton Road will be one of the routes vehicles will use to avoid Warwick Road while it is closed. Therefore having planned works taking place on this route while the closures are in place could cause major disruption and be against the public interest, as well as causing reputational damage to the City Council. Although the Daventry Road scheme was originally planned to be completed in plenty of time before this date, due to the design and consultation process taking longer than expected, and now the petition being received, there won't be enough time to complete the scheme before 23rd March should the decision be delayed by the call-in process.

- (1) That in the judgment of the Coventry City Council it is expedient for the Council to oppose the High Speed Rail (London – West Midlands) Bill introduced in the Session of Parliament 2013-14.
- (2) That the Cabinet Member (Business, Enterprise and Employment), the Executive Director, Place and Assistant Director, Legal & Democratic Services take all necessary steps to carry the foregoing Resolution into effect, that the Common Seal be affixed to any necessary documents and that confirmation be given that Sharpe Pritchard (Parliamentary Agents) be authorised to sign the Petition of the Council against the Bill.

The value of the order for construction contract is not to exceed the value of the grant available from the Homes and Communities Agency.
- Approve that in the event that the grant available from the Homes and Communities Agency is withdrawn, or the work not completed by 31 March 2015, and the City Council has incurred expenditure that this expenditure is incurred from the City Councils capital budget.
- 4. Approve inclusion of the project in the Capital programme for 2014/15 as part of the City Councils annual budget setting process.
- 5. Delegate authority to Cabinet Member (Housing and Heritage) and Cabinet Member (Community Safety and Equalities) to take decisions as to how both the re-build and other issues in relation to the management of the site are progressed.
- 6. To accept further reports, as required regarding the progression of the redevelopment of the site.

#Report 10 Friargate Bridge – Additional Works

Recommendations

Cabinet are requested to:

- 1. Note the funding award by European Regional Development Fund for £7.235 million for additional works to Friargate Bridge.
- 2. Approve project management and design costs of £0.744million will be incurred at risk up until June 2014 when contracts are planned to be signed for additional works.
- 3. Approve the Early Works Agreement for the Bridge Deck and project management and design costs up to February 2014 for £0.7million to enable site clearance and mobilisation prior to target contract price agreement.
- 4. Authorise the City Council to act as guarantor for this additional funding, and provide delegated authority for the Executive Director, Place to enter into a Grant Aid Agreement with Friargate Coventry LLP in order to fund their element of the additional works.
- Retrospectively approve the delegation of authority of the Executive Director, Place to enter into a Grant Funding Agreement for the ERDF funding with the Department for Communities and Local Government.
