Report 4 Petition – Request for Change to Waiting Restrictions in Moreall Meadows

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to:

- i. Approve that informal consultation is carried out with all the residents of Moreall Meadows and adjoining cul de sacs to establish if there is a widespread support for the amendment of the current waiting restrictions to 10am to 11am and 2pm to 3pm, Monday to Friday, only.
- ii. Approve that an amendment to the current waiting restrictions is advertised in accordance with the outcome of the informal consultation.

Report 5 Report Back – Petition – Request for Crossing Facilities at Leamington Road and Baginton Road

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to:

- Note the results of the pedestrian and traffic surveys which have been carried out on Baginton Road in the vicinity of the junction with The Chesils.
- ii) Note that the results of the traffic speed surveys show that the location does not meet the Perceived Safety Scheme criteria.
- iii) Note that the results of the pedestrian crossing and traffic volume surveys show that funding a controlled pedestrian crossing cannot be justified at this location.

The above recommendations were approved.

Report 6 Objections to Proposed Waiting Restrictions

Recommendations

Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to:

- i) consider the objections to the proposed waiting restrictions;
- ii) subject to recommendation 1, approve that the making of the Stoney Stanton Road proposal is deferred to enable monitoring to be undertaken to determine the turnover of spaces when the existing 1 hour restriction is not in operation.
- iii) subject to recommendation 1, approve the implementation of the double yellow lines on the London Road Service Road and Stoney Road as proposed and monitor to determine if any further extensions are required.
- iv) subject to recommendation 1, approve the implementation of the proposed restriction on Earlsdon Avenue South, Bedworth Road, Holyhead Road and Brightwalton Road / Mary Herbert Road as proposed.
- v) subject to recommendation 1, approve the implementation of the double yellow lines on the junction of Foxton Road/Oxendon Way as proposed and a reduced extent of double yellow lines on Princethorpe Way.

The above recommendations were approved, with the following additional recommendation:

vi) Request officers to review the double yellow lines in the layby at the London Road service road along with the options to provide additional parking.

Report 7 Objections to Foleshill Road Area 20mph Zone

Recommendations

- i) consider the objections to the proposed 20mph zone;
- subject to recommendation 1, approve the making of the City of Coventry (Foleshill Road Area)(20mph limit Zone and Revocation)
 Order 2014 as advertised.

Report 8 The Introduction of a Permit Scheme to Improve Management of Street Works Across Coventry and Warwickshire

Recommendations

- 1. Approve that officers, in conjunction with Warwickshire County Council, develop a detailed business case for the introduction of a Coventry and Warwickshire streetworks Permit Scheme.
- Approve that a report back is made to a future meeting of the Cabinet Member (Public Services) to review the detailed business case.
- Subject to the satisfactory outcome of the detailed business case, approve the delegation of authority to the Assistant Director (Planning, Transport and Highways) in consultation with the Cabinet Member (Public Services) to submit an application to the Secretary of State for Transport alongside Warwickshire County Council for the introduction of a Permit Scheme.

#Report 3 2014/15 Council Tax Setting Report

Recommendations

That Cabinet recommend to Council the approval of recommendations (1) to (5).

Council are recommended:

- (1) To note the following Council Tax base amounts for the year 2014/15, as approved by Cabinet on 7th January 2014, in accordance with Regulations made under Section 31B of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 (as amended) ("the Act"):
 - (a) 73,201.0 being the amount calculated by the Council as its Council Tax base for the year for the whole Council area;
 - (b) Allesley 298.3 Keresley 208.9

being the amounts calculated by the Council as its Council Tax base for the year for dwellings in those parts of its area to which one or more special items relate.

- (2) That the following amounts be now calculated by the Council for the year 2014/15 in accordance with Sections 31A, 31B and 34 to 36 of the Act:
 - (a) £714,815,082 being the aggregate of the amounts that the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to it by Parish Councils (Gross Expenditure and reserves required to be raised for estimated future expenditure)
 - (b) £616,026,999 being the aggregate of the amounts that the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(3) of the Act. (Gross Income including reserves to be used to meet the Gross Expenditure but excluding Council Tax income);

		calculated by the Council in accordance with
		Section 31A(4) of the Act, as its Council Tax

being the amount at (2) (c) above divided by the amount at (1) (a) above, calculated by the Council in accordance with Section 31B of the Act, as the basic amount of its Council Tax for the year. (Average Council Tax at Band D for the City including Parish Precepts).

#Report 4 Budget Report 2014/15

 - (ix) a matter where the associated report has already been considered by the Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee or a Scrutiny Board who have endorsed the recommendations or made recommendations that have been accepted by the Cabinet/Cabinet Member.
