Report 5 Approval to Formalise Cycle Ways Within the Cycle Coventry Programme.

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Energy and Environment) is recommended to:

1. Approve the appropriation of land currently held as open space to use for highway purposes (cycle track) identified in the attached plans (Appendix B) and listed as route sections 1.5, 3.2, 3.6, 3.7, 3.10b, 3.11, 6.9, 6.10, using S.122 Local Government Act 1972, and subject to the statutory notice process and the consideration of any objections received;

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to:

- Subject to the above resolution, accept the appropriation of the former open space land referred to above for highway purposes and approve the construction of cycle tracks on such land using Section 24 of the Highways Act 1980 as identified in the attached plans (Appendix B) and listed as route sections 1.5, 3.2, 3.6, 3.7, 3.10b, 3.11, 6.9, 6.10, and known as:
 - 1.5 Cash's Park

- 3.2 Stoke Heath Park
- 3.6, 3.7 Sowe Valley recreation ground,
- 3.10b New Green Park (Sowe Valley)
- 3.11 Wyken Croft recreation ground (Sowe Valley)
- 6.9, 6.10 Canley Green recreation ground,
- 2. Accept the new areas of cycle track as adopted highway and authorise the amendment of the Council's highway adoption records accordingly.

Report 4 Petition – Condition of Carriageway at Hill Street, St Michael's

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member is recommended to approve:

1. That the area of carriageway between Corporation Street and (up to and including) the junction of Bond Street be considered for inclusion in the Highways Capital funded forward programme of carriageway resurfacing work for repair in the financial year 2015/16.

The above recommendation was approved, together with the following additional recommendation -

2. That officers monitor the condition of the highway.

Report 5 Petition: King William Street – Request for Loading Bay

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to approve that a variation to the existing waiting restrictions on King William Street is advertised to create a loading bay into the existing parking bay at its Canterbury Street end.

The above recommendation was approved.

Report 6 Petition for a Dropped Kerb and to Improve Road Safety Measures on Thistley Fields and Holloway Fields

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to approve that:

- 1. A speed survey is carried out on Thistley Field West and Holloway Field and the results reported back to Cabinet Member (Public Services) within six months for consideration of whether the area meets the Perceived Safety scheme criteria and how it will be prioritised in the roll-out of 20 mph speed limits across the City.
- 2. A procedure is drawn up by officers for the private funding of individual dropped kerbs which does not adversely affect the delivery of the capital funded programme.

The above recommendations were approved.

Report 7 Petition – Request for Funding / Sponsorship of the Parking Project in Front of the Shops on Hipswell Highway

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Cabinet Member (Public Services) approves that continued advice and support is given to the shop owners for the creation of a parking area on private land, but notes that the City Council cannot contribute any funding to this project.

The above recommendation was deleted and the following recommendation was approved:-

That the Cabinet Member deferred the consideration of the petition to a future meeting.

Report 8 Petition – Parking in Arden Street and Warwick Street

Recommendations

The Cabinet Member (Public Services) is recommended to approve that the Traffic and Network Management Team draw up proposals for a parking scheme for Arden Street, Warwick Street, Clarendon Street and Moor Street which will include the review of the existing waiting restrictions.

Recommendations

- i) Note the speed checks undertaken on Emerson Road recorded an average speed below 28mph.
- ii) Endorse that it is not included on the perceived safety scheme list.

- 3. That the Executive Director, Place is instructed to bring back a further report to a future meeting that provides an update on the transfer process and seeks approval for future maintenance standards.
