Report 4 2014/15 Third Quarter Financial Monitoring Report (to December 2014)

Report 6 Ending Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) in Coventry

Recommendations:

Cabinet is recommended to approve:

- 1) The instigation of a targeted campaign to prevent FGM through awareness raising, education, training and empowerment.
- 2) Continued support to West Midlands Police to enforce the law on FGM.
- That all suspected FGM cases continue to be referred as part of existing child safeguarding obligations in line with Coventry Safeguarding Board procedures.
- 4) The continued support from the FGM Task and Finish Group to health colleagues at University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire (UHCW) to offer support to women and girls affected by FGM.
- 5) The continued focus by Public Health on improving data gathering, recording and sharing to ensure effective monitoring of prevalence and trends.

- 6) The implementation of alternative educational approaches for dealing with the issue of Female Genital Mutilation to encourage local schools to engage in raising pupils' awareness of FGM.
- 7) The implementation of an Ending FGM Project.

 - (e) a matter where the associated report has already been considered by the Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee or a Scrutiny Board who have endorsed the recommendations or made recommendations that have been accepted by the Cabinet/Cabinet Member.
- 2. The call-in form is not completed correctly.

- 4. The reason for the call-in is unclear or does not relate directly to the decision specified on the call-in form.
