SUBJECT: Allesley Hotel Variation to Premise license

OBJECTION TO VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENSE UNDER PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER.

An application has been submitted for the Allesley Hotel to vary the premises license to increase hours for late night refreshment from 1200hrs until 0200hrs every day both indoor and outdoors, and the sale of alcohol from 1200hrs until 0200hrsevery day for both on and off sales.

The hotel is situated in a small village surrounded by numerous residential properties, and until recently has not been an issue for the responsible authorities. During the summer of 2015 the premises was raised as a problem premises at the Responsible Authority meeting by various agencies. The main issues raised were poor management, lack of control, selling alcohol out of hours and an increase in complaints/reported incidents. The multi-agency approach involved Coventry City Licensing, The Police, Environmental Protection, and Safeguarding Children. Visits were conducted as was training and advice to staff within the premises. Complaints still came in to the various departments and further visits and advice was given reiterating previous points raised. In November 2015 a letter highlighting the short comings of the hotel was instigated by Coventry City Councils Head of regulatory Services. This highlighted

concerns around Safeguarding children, Health & Safety, Licensing, and Community Safety.

Over the last 12 months there has been a significant increase in the amount of calls to the hotel of which 23.8% relate to incidents after 11pm. All apart from one of these logs relates to disorder and most of those are alcohol related. In particular a call is received at 0125hrs on the 29th September where there is large scale disorder at the hotel, following a wedding. The Police log states that there is a fight, the hotel is being vandalised and that males are forcing themselves on girls. Not only did this highlight lack of control at the hotel, but that the premises had been selling alcohol after 11pm, thus breaching the current operating schedule. Other calls are from staff stating that there are drunken residents being aggressive and abusive towards them, shouting and arguing outside the hotel, drinking within rooms and then fighting, domestic disputes, assaults, drunken persons loitering around cars acting suspicious etc.

Not included in this are the numerous calls that were received direct to the local Neighbourhood Policing Team. These Officers have also attended Ward Forums, residents meetings and 'Cuppa with a copper' sessions where numerous complaints and concerns were raised about the hotel. These are not logged directly but have had a massive impact on workload for the officers and lives of local residents. Again local officers have tried to work with the premises, but have found management to be difficult to work with. Most recently staff have refused to provide witness statements with regards to a crime occurring at the hotel, which would have been vital evidence. It is feared that if the hours of trade for both late night refreshment and sale of alcohol were to be increased to 2am incorporating both on and off license and in and outdoors, this would only

increase the potential for further incidents of crime and disorder, and anti-social behaviour in the area.

At present the hotel struggle to deal with incidents in day time hours when there is extra staff at hotel. At night they operate skeleton staff numbers, meaning it would be even more difficult to deal with incidents. Regularly there is no staff on the reception area meaning persons are allowed to enter the hotel with guests undetected. This obviously increases the potential for disorder and CSE.

Control within the bar area also appears to be an issue too. An example of this is a Police log where staff have called because of a drunken male whom has been served at the premises and taxi drivers will not take him as he is too intoxicated. The log states that staff feel they have a 'duty of care' for the male as it is their fault he is so drunk.

All in all it is felt that the hotel do not appear to take their responsibilities seriously and that there is a lack of control over guests residing at the hotel. Staffing levels, and relevantly trained staff do not appear to be at the correct level to cope with the demands of the hotel, which in turn leads to a disproportionately high level of calls to the Police.

As previously stated the West Midlands Police would like to object to the extension in hours of trade, and also request that the committee consider applying the following conditions to the premises license.

- (1) CCTV to operate at the premises to the agreed standard of the West Midlands Police. Images are to be retained for a minimum of 31 days and be made available to download at the request of the responsible authorities.
- (2) All staff to be trained in basic licensing laws and Child sexual exploitation awareness. This is to be documented and refreshed on a 6 monthly basis.
- (3) The DPS or a personal license holder is to be on the premises at all times.
- (4) A refusals and incident book are to be maintained.
- (5) All staff working at the hotel must be easily identifiable and be dressed appropriately. This is for customers/guests to be able to identify these individuals as staff working at the hotel.

Below are some of the emails received by me from the Councillors directly from local residents:

"Friends of mine live across the road and have been plagued by the noise of cars revving engines outside their house, blasting of car horns and verbally abused by the perpetrators when asked to reduce or to cease the noise. Those that were causing the disturbances were guests at weddings at the hotel. They have also complained to the appropriate authority with regard to the matter, only to have no response or actions being taken against the hotel for any of it. It seems to me the hotel owners have friends in high places"

"Last night we had all the stereo typical antics of a televised Gypsy wedding glasses smashed in the road kids shouting at cars obstructing their path through the village, kicking wheelie bins throwing litter around the place. I had a mouthful off a bunch of kids when I went out asking who kicked my wheelie bin.

At approximately 1.30 am in the morning when half the village was awake by the car racing antics a resident was subjected to a hail of insults and suggestions as she leant out the window and hollered something at a bunch of men who retaliated by asking how much for her services!

We were tempted to call the police earlier on as you could just tell there was trouble in the air but we tried to put any preconceptions as to how the night was going to end up to one side only to find that thats exactly how the night ended up.

This Hotel is taking no responsibility for its place in the village on many fronts and I would like to enquire as if it is worth objecting to a renewal of their license or at least give them a bit of a shake up as to taking some responsibility in the community or restricting what they can and cannot do with this venue. I'm off outside now to sweep the broken glass up that was left last night before a dog injures itself."

"I am writing to inform you of the increasing hostility that is emerging amongst the residents of the Village towards the comings and goings at Allesley Hotel.

We live near the hotel and putting the un-kept nature of the building aside, I would like to draw your attention to the impact on the community the current influx of "hotel guests" are having. It is clear that the hotel is being used to house people that are transient and in need of temporary accommodation. I cannot

generalise about the behaviour of the intakes but we have seen a rise in antisocial activity of late.

Only yesterday I spoke to someone who was spitting in the bus shelter; reminding them that school children use the service on a daily basis, only to be very rudely abused. Several youths have been wandering around the front of the hotel and therefore our houses, clearly with nothing to do, whilst we go to work and leave our properties unprotected.

I am aware of the rise in theft and break ins in the local area and I feel our property is at risk. I am away on business regularly and I am even getting nervous about leaving my wife in the house overnight on her own.

I have contacted the hotel previously to inform them that youths were leaning out the bedroom windows on the front of their building abusing people walking down the street.

The feelings are running high amongst residents and there is belief that not only is this practise of putting these people in to the community making it a less desirable place to live but also devaluing the properties in Allesley within the conservation area. Whilst mentioning the conservation area, the residents within it take pride in the upkeep of the beautiful properties most of which are graded buildings. This cannot be said for the Hotel which looks an eye saw and hugely embarrasses the residents when they see so many tourists walking around. Cannot something be done to put pressure on the owners to bring it up to the condition that the conservation area deems satisfactory and that the area deserves or do Coventry and the council in particular not see Allesley as an attraction anymore to be proud of?

I hope you understand my reasons to write, I have been silent for 10 months now but cannot bare this situation to deteriorate even more.

I look forward to your response and indeed help for the community on this matter. Please be rest assured that we will continue to monitor what is going on and we will continue to contact the council (and the Police if required) should things not remedied to our satisfaction."

"I feel I must make a complaint about the state of the Allesley Hotel. These buildings are in a conservation area and also listed. They are in a dreadful state of repair and it brings the whole village down. I am also not very pleased at having ex -offenders staying there at the tax payers expense. We pay a lot of Council Tax in Allesley and money should not be used for this purpose. Police vans are seen going in and coming out of the entrance which does not look very good. The owner doesn't appear care about the state of the buildings or who he lets the rooms to. Elderly residents have also expressed their concern and feel insecure."

"Three weeks ago what appeared to be drunken young men were literally racing around the village in their flash cars."

There is some justification for the residents' concerns. The calls for service at the hotel are dispropotionately high, there are 155 calls in total and between October 2015 and mid January 2016 there were 22 calls from the hotel. This is a considerable drain on resources. The incidents are often classified as disorder and require an immediate response. Looking further at the 22 calls, there were only two calls which resulted in crimes being recorded. Alcohol pays a large part in the calls that are received from the hotel. Efforts to engage with the staff to work together to reduce crime and disorder have largely proved fruitless, the working relationship could certainly improve. The latest report that came in to me was 4/3/16 at 0218 hours of a drunken female refusing to leave and causing a disturbance in one of the bedrooms.

Finally i can confirm that we have had criminal incidents at the venue where staff have refused to assist in a police investigation. An example of this is when there was a vehicle broken into on the carpark of the Allesley Hotel and the staff member was a witness to it but they refused to provide an evidential statement in relation to what they had seen.

Taking the above into account, I fully believe that making alcohol readily available for longer periods would only exacerbate the issues already present. It is for these reasons that I must object to any extension to the current licencing hours at the Allesley Hotel.
