To whom it may Concern,

Upon viewing a notice outside 171 Bellgreen Road CV6 7GW I wish to object to this premises being allowed to sell alcohol. The premises is located very close to my flat [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. I [REDACTED] who works shifts in a retail store and relies on public transport. The bus stop to city centre is currently opposite this premises.

I feel alcohol being sold near the bus stop would compromise my safety.

The bus stop already gets rough with drunks at night time and the area can be quite scary and dangerous. There is no need to add to this by supplying alcohol opposite. The bus stop had: glass smashed, litter around it, drunks and youths hanging around on a regular basis. Also, buses are scheduled to come less frequently at night so there can be a half an hour wait for next bus after 7pm.

Clearly, supplying more alcohol in an area like this is simply adding fuel to the fire and making the area more dangerous and disorderly. This would be especially concerning for people who are dependent on public transport and have to use the bus stop opposite the premises. We will be forced to wait for up to half an hour amongst this chaos. People who rely on public transport include vulnerable people, such as: young people, including myself, who do not drive, disabled people and the elderly. As vulnerable members of society we should be protected and should not have to deal with even more disruptive and frightening behaviour because of alcohol being supplied opposite. I hope you understand my concerns and prevent this premises selling alcohol.

I wish to object to the alcohol licence application by premises, Mr, Osbourne Victor Frank, Vincy Foods, 171 Bell Green Road Coventry CV6 7GW, to provide alcohol on an off sales at this address.

I have an interest in this application that is greater than the general public's because I live less than one kilometer from the location.

I object to the application on the following grounds:

**420 ft from Courthouse Green Primary School**

Young children need to have the freedom to safely walk to school or to stay behind after school activities without having the fear of being abused or attacked by someone under the influence of alcohol.

It is our duty to protect the safety of our children from being harmed by the perpetrators under the influence of alcohol. This is an area that is already high in alcohol and drug related crimes, anti social behaviour, violent and criminal damage and will only get worse.

The children have just gone back to school. Not many parents or teachers are aware of this application. A strong petition against the application will be put forward as well as contacting the local MP.

**There are already 4 Off licenses selling alcohol in the area less than a kilometre from the location:**

Bell Green Food & Wine 175 Bell Green Road

Nisa Local 10-12 Bell Green Road

Caribbean Trade Ltd 171 Bell Green road

Mace Express Convenience Store 644 Sewall Highway

**There are also 2 pubs and a local supermarket within close proximity to the location**

An area which is already overpopulated with the freedom of selling alcohol does not need another license in the community.

This is allowing young vulnerable children to accept alcohol and encouraging them towards trying it.

It is a proven fact especially in troubled areas alcohol increases public nuisance, crime and disorder, noise and endangers public safety. The local drug and alcohol rehab centers and charities are already stretched into helping victims.

**Safety of local residents**

As part of my health routine I go out for daily walks, however to walk past people consuming alcohol would prevent me from going out especially when it turns dark. I personally would feel apprehensive and insecure to walk past people who have been consuming alcohol. This would have an impact on my health, especially as I my job involves sitting down majority of the time.

There are also the elderly who tend to go to the local shops for their daily shop, and should feel safe to continue, without having the fear of being threatened, abused or robbed.

I strongly object and plead for you not to grant the license. The safety of the local residents is at risk.
