Subject: One Coventry Plan Annual Performance Report 2021-22

1 Purpose of the Note

1.1 To inform Cabinet of the outcomes of the consideration by Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee of the report on the One Coventry Plan Annual Performance Report 2021-22 at their meeting on 20th July 2022.

2 **Recommendations**

- 2.1 Cabinet is recommended:
 - That the spend on agency staff be reviewed and officers be asked to explore the viability of creating an income generating Coventry City Council employment agency
 - 2) To note the following amendments requested by Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee, made to the final report:
 - i. Information on how many children in the City do not have access to a computer and internet at home in relation to educational outcomes
 - ii. Additional information on air quality monitoring be included to highlight the robustness of the process
 - iii. Within the road casualty statistics, include information on motorbikes/motor scooters/electric scooters
 - iv. Include a reference to poverty in the inequalities section

3 Background and Information

- 3.1 At their meeting on 20th July 2022, Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee considered a report on the One Coventry Plan Annual Performance Report 2021-22.
- 3.2 The Committee considered the report and agreed that all of the indicators that were not met would be considered by the appropriate Scrutiny Board as part of their Work Programme
- 3.3 The Committee asked questions of officers and the Cabinet Member and requested the following:
 - Information on jobs created by sector to be circulated
 - An explanation of sickness absence at Coventry City Council be provided
 - Information to be provided on rates of recycling for commercial waste and how this may have been impacted by the industrial action

- Information to be provided on the data set used to define healthy life expectancy
- Consideration to be given to extending "Ask for Angela" to retail premises
- Increase publicity as to where those experiencing Domestic Abuse can access support
