Petition – Changes to the Cost of Starley Road Visitors' Parking Permits

I refer to the above petition which you submitted to the Cabinet Member (City Services) meeting on Tuesday 24th January, 2012. Following the end of the call-in period, I write to confirm that at this meeting Councillor Harvard took account of the issues that you and the petition organiser raised regarding the request to suspend the recent change to the cost of the Starley Road visitor parking permits.

Councillor Harvard noted the concerns that the change had been introduced without consultation. He was informed that, earlier this year, the Council's supplier rationalised their product lines and withdrew the book of ten scratch cards. However, as the books containing 25 scratch cards cost the same as a book containing 10, the change-over represented better value for money for both the Council and customer. Following the introduction of these new books, Parking Services initially continued to charge residents £10 for a book of 25, however, during August 2011 this was changed to £20 in order to reflect the increase in the number of permits.

Councillor Harvard took into account the comments you made regarding the problems caused to residents by recent developments in the vicinity of Starley Road and to the impact of the night time economy.

He decided to endorse the proposal to suspend the change in the cost of Starley Road visitors' parking permits and gave approval for the cost of a book of 25 visitor parking permits to revert to £10 until June, 2012 at the earliest. He also requested that any future changes in the cost of resident parking permits or visitors' parking permits were subject to Cabinet Member (City Services) approval prior to implementation.



In response to your request, he authorised the officers to reimburse any residents who had purchased the visitor parking permits at £20, so ensuring they would have been charged just £10. In addition, he asked the Director of City Services and Development to carry out a review of the Starley Road residents parking scheme including the hours of operation and involving consultation, with a further report being submitted to a future Cabinet Member meeting within the next six months.

No doubt you will inform the petitioners accordingly. I am sending a copy of this letter to for their information.
