
## **Appendix 5 – Members Survey Results**

The Coventry Community Safety Partnership (CCSP) consultation was presented to the Scrutiny Committee on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024. Members received a survey afterwards to provide feedback. The results of the survey are presented below.

Members identified Tackling Serious Violence (gangs and knife crime) as a top priority, followed by addressing Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB), Domestic Abuse and Safety in the Night-Time Economy (NTE).

## What topics do you think should be a priority for the CSP?


- 1 Tackling Serious Violence (knife crime)
- 2 Tackling Serious Organised Crime (Gangs)
- 3 Taking action against Anti-Social Behaviour
- 4 Taking Action on Domestic Abuse/violence
- 5 Tackling Violence in the Night-Time Economy
- 6 Tackling Exploitation and supporting victims of crime (Modern Slavery/Hate crime /other hidden crimes)
- 7 Tackling Environmental Crime (Fly tipping, littering )
- 8 Tackling Youth Violence
- 9 Tackling and Preventing Terrorism
- 10 Tackling Drugs and Alcohol



The primary concerns in the city centre included Safety in the NTE, environmental issues rough sleeping and begging.

Members indicated that resource constraints were the biggest challenges faced by agencies.

Obtaining evidence of those responsible for the crime


Lack of reporting of issues

There was a consensus on the need for agencies to work collaboratively to address location-based issues such as ASB.

#### Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?




Members noted that a perceived lack of faith in services was a notable challenge for victims, emphasising the need for improved support systems for crime victims. They observed that victim-blaming attitudes presented additional difficulties for victims.

#### What is the biggest challenges facing victims of crime?



Members felt that victims knew how to report crime and access services. The Council prioritises victims and generally offers victim-focused services. However, there are concerns about insufficient resources and the risk of vulnerable people failing through the gaps of service provision.


## Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?



Members concluded that we can better support victims of crime by improving the information provided on support services. Additionally, we should focus on developing our workforce to effectively identify and support victims while also making it easier to report crimes or seek assistance.

#### How can we better support victims of crime?


- 1 Providing better information to victims on support services

It was suggested that offending and reoffending could be better addressed through supported accommodation and early intervention via mentoring and support to deter individuals, particularly the youth, from entering the criminal justice system.

#### What measures should be taken to reduce reoffending?

- 1 Providing settled and stable accommodation
- 2 Early intervention through mentoring and family support schemes
- Mentoring and support to prevent young perpetrators from transitioning to adult crime.
- 4 Providing Mental health support
- 5 Diverting young people away from the criminal justice system.
- 6 Better use of Out of Court Disposal and Community Orders.
- Schemes to provide Education and employment to newly released offenders.
- 8 Restorative and reparative work (unpaid work , restorative justice)
- Rehabilitation programmes to target perpetrators of
- 10 Providing Support with substance misuse.



There is a need to ensure that the role and activities of the CCSP are adequately promoted to enhance public understanding of its functions.
