Annex 1

Mandatory Conditions

Section 19 Licensing Act 2003

Where this licence authorises the supply of alcohol,

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the licence:
 - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor (DPS) in respect of the licence, or
 - b. at a time when the DPS does not hold a personal licence or that licence is suspended
2. Every supply of alcohol under the licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Section 20 Licensing Act 2003

Where this licence authorises the exhibition of films,

- (1) the admission of children to the exhibition of any film will be restricted.
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless otherwise stated, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where :
 - i. the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - ii. the licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

Section 21 Licensing Act 2003

Where this licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be on the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

Where a licence authorises alcohol to be consumed on the premises the following conditions apply:

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request,

before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Conditions agreed with Police:

1. CCTV to operate at the premises to the agreed standard of the West Midlands Police. Images are to be retained for a minimum of 28 days and be made available to download at the request of the responsible authorities.
2. Refusals are to be monitored and documented.
3. All staff are to be trained in basic licensing laws, child sexual exploitation and conflict management. This is to be documented and refreshed on a 6 monthly basis.
4. Challenge 25 is to operate at the premises.
5. A minimum of two members of staff will be employed at the premises when they are opening past 23:00hrs.

Conditions agreed with Trading Standards:

All alcoholic and tobacco products should be purchased from legitimate, traceable sources that provide receipts relating to the purchased items. Goods in possession or sold should not evade any duty or taxes and should be authentic goods that are permissible to be sold for consumption in the UK market. Where required by legislation, all alcoholic products must contain a duty stamp on its label. All receipts and records will be made available to officers of Coventry City Council or other Responsible Authority for inspection when requested by that officer.

a) General. – All four Licensing Objectives

We will not sell alcohol to anyone that is under the age of 18, or anyone that is intoxicated. They will be asked to leave the premises. We have a CCTV system which operates 24 hours a day.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder.

CCTV is operating in the premises, it is installed across the shop and there is clear view to the entrance of the premises.
There will also be a warning notice to deter any criminal activity. We will not sell alcohol to anyone that is under the age of 18, or anyone that is intoxicated. Staff will be adequately trained.

c) Public safety.

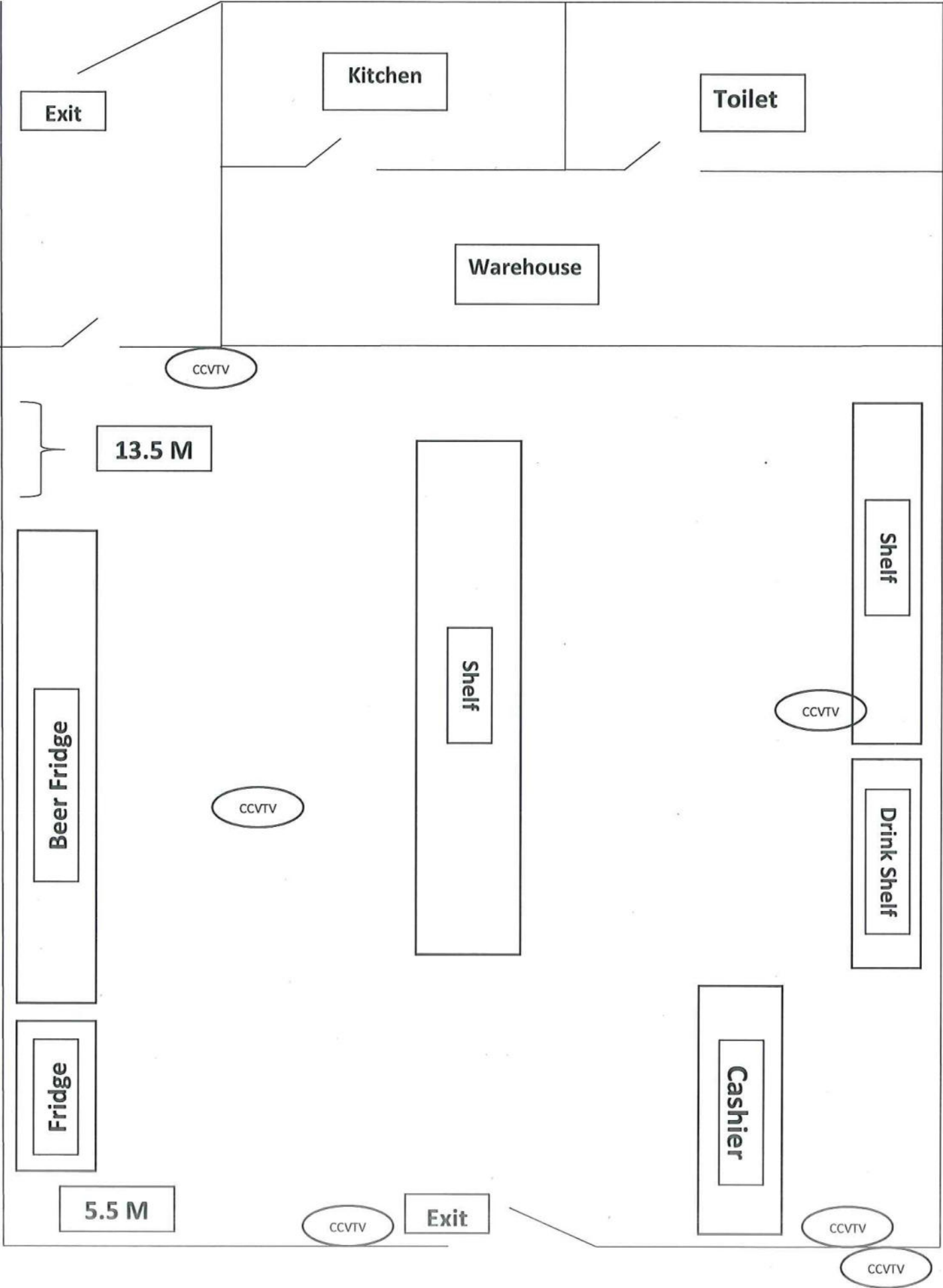
We have well trained staff members who will ensure that acceptable forms of ID verification will be photographic and challenge 25 will be adapted.
There is also internal and external lighting fixed to promote public safety objectives.

d) The prevention of public nuisance.

The operating schedule will be adhered to which will ensure that customers are asked to leave the premises quietly and to be considerate of local residents. Customers will be asked not to stand around the premises and will not be served alcohol after the operating hours specified.

e) The protection of children from harm.

We will adopt challenge 25 policy and photographic ID verification will be in place.
