Executive Summary

Report title: Scrutiny Annual Report 2025-26

1. Context (or background)

- 1.1 Coventry City Council operates the Executive/Scrutiny model of Governance, as established by the Local Government Act 2000.
- 1.2 The Council has five Scrutiny Boards covering all aspects of the Council, as well as a Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee, which is responsible for the overall management of the Scrutiny and Overview function.
- 1.3 Scrutiny Boards have the power to investigate any matters they consider relevant to their work area and to make recommendations to the Council, the Cabinet, any Cabinet Member or any other Committee of the Council as they see fit.
- 1.4 The membership of the Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee and Scrutiny Boards is determined by full Council and reflects political proportionality.
- 1.5 The Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee and each Scrutiny Board is responsible for setting its own work programme and in doing so consults with relevant Cabinet Members and the Leadership Board. They also consider the wishes of those Members of the Scrutiny Board who are not members of the largest political group on the Council.
- 1.6 At its meeting on 25 June 2026, Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee approved the Annual Report for Council with the inclusion of an additional section detailing instances where call-in did not apply on grounds of urgency. This is included at page 7 of Appendix 1.

2. Options considered and recommended proposal

- 2.1 The Constitution requires Scrutiny to report to Council on an annual basis as part of the functions of Scrutiny. Therefore, Council is recommended to:
