◆Report 4 **One Coventry Plan Annual Performance Report (April 2025 – March 2026)**

Recommendations:

The Cabinet is recommended to:

- 1) Consider any recommendations or comments made by Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee.
- 2) Approve the One Coventry Plan Annual Performance Report 2025/26 attached as Appendix 1 to the report.
- 3) Note the areas of strong performance, including good development at age 5, repeat referrals to Children Social Care, satisfaction of carers, homelessness, visitor trips, carbon disclosure score, condition of principal roads, fly-tipping actions, and areas requiring further focus, particularly economic inactivity, youth unemployment, deprivation, health inequalities, recycling, green space inequality and city centre footfall.

- 4) Agree that priority areas for improvement are reflected in in-year performance monitoring and reported through the corporate leadership dashboard.

Report 5 GreenPower Park Development

Recommendations:

The Cabinet is recommended to:

- 1) Approve the submission of a hybrid planning application for the development of GreenPower Park, located at the former Coventry Airport site and shown in Appendix 1 to the report.
- 2) Approve expenditure of up to £1m (as a 50% share) funded corporately in advance of future capital receipts to be used towards the preparation and the submission of the hybrid planning application for the GreenPower Park site based on the site's designation as a major employment site in the South Warwickshire Local Plan.
- 3) Delegate authority to the Interim Director of Economic Growth to take all such actions as is deemed necessary and incidental for the submission of the planning application including the procurement and award of contracts relating to the design team and associated consultants.

♦Report 6 City Centre Public Spaces Protection Order 2026

Recommendations:

The Cabinet is recommended to:

- 1) Note the consultation outcome (Appendix 3a of the report) and accompanying Equality Impact Assessment (Appendix 4 of the report).

- 2) Consider any comments and/or Recommendations received from Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee following their consideration of this matter at their meeting on 26 August 2026.
- 3) Consider and approve a new City Centre PSPO (Appendix 1 of the report).
- 4) Delegate authority to the Director of Law, Governance and Safer Communities to bring the Order into effect from 21st November 2026.

Cabinet approved recommendations 1),3) and 4) above.

In considering recommendation 2) above, whilst approving Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee's recommendations 1) and 3), Cabinet took on board comments and concerns raised at the meeting and amended the Committee's recommendation 2) as follows:

- 2) That a separate evidence-gathering exercise and targeted consultation to determine whether the statutory tests required under Section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 be undertaken in relation to the concealing of identity for the purpose of crime, anti-social behaviour, intimidation, harassment, alarm or distress be undertaken in relation to the City Centre.**

○Report 7 2026/27 First Quarter Financial Monitoring Report (to June 2026)

Recommendations:

The Cabinet is recommended to:

- 1) Approve the Council's first quarter revenue monitoring position.
- 2) Approve the revised forecast capital outturn position for the year of £198.2m incorporating: £26.5m rescheduling from 2025/26 outturn, £4.0m net increase in spending relating to approved/technical changes and £1.8m of net programme acceleration of expenditure from future years.

Limitations on Call-in

 - (iii) a decision made by an employee exercising delegated authority.
 - (iv) decisions of the Licensing and Regulatory Committee.
 - (v) decisions of the Planning Committee.
 - (vi) decisions of the Appeals and Appointments Panels.
 - (vii) decisions of the Audit and Procurement Committee.
 - (viii) a matter where the associated report has already been considered by the Scrutiny Co-ordination Committee or a Scrutiny Board who have endorsed the recommendations or made recommendations that have been accepted by the Cabinet/Cabinet Member.
